DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING April 18, 2015

The third meeting of the 2014-15 District Board of Trustees was held on April 18, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Bob Raub presided. The meeting was called to order at 9:30AM.

The invocation was provided by Trustee Ann Graves.

All board members were present except Trustees Judy Janes and Kate Feryo.

Guests included Circle K District Administrator Kelly Shaup, Laws & Regulations Chair Matt Wise, Past Governor and Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski & David, and Key Leader District Chair Stef Stamatopoulos.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages p4 -p19)

Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski provided a report on new club building activities throughout the District. Trustees present spoke on membership activities and concerns in the regions; Governor-elect Jen spoke for Region 7.

Cathy Szymanski and others will be developing an incentive contest membership growth with existing clubs.

The reports on new clubs built in the last 3 year were reviewed. Discussion took place on the manner in which new club mentoring reports take place and how the information is gathered. In the future, information will be gathered by past governors via contact with The Formula assigned club counselors.

Consent Agenda (See the pages p20-p54)

All items in the consent agenda were approved.

Discussion and Action items

A review of the District budget, investments and account balances took place. See the pages p55 ~p61.

A report was provided on the District Super Raffle. See page p62.

The District shirt program was discussed. See page p63 for more information.

The energy/electric program was discussed as well as proposal for computer security software marketing. After discussion, it was agreed that Executive Director Kevin Thomas would contact Glen VanDyke to see if we could get his support in putting a push on the energy program and that we would not pursue the computer security program.

The Key Club District Convention was reviewed. See pages p66-p67.

Information and comments were provided on changes in Service Leadership Program administrators.

Discussion on Trustee and Lt. Governor vacancies for 2015-16 were discussed and review.

Discussion was held on club officer education. The District has a new master trainer, Dennis Bouchard from the Norlanco-Rheems club. Potential certified instructors were discussed.

A review of the 2015 Midwinter conference took place. See pages p71 & p78-p80.

Discussion took place on the 2016 Midwinter conference and the 2017 Midwinter conference. A motion was introduced, seconded and approved to solicit a proposal for the 2017 Midwinter Conference from the Penn Stater Hotel.

May 14th will be the date for a conference call to approve the 2015 District Convention budget and program. Convention promotion and activity were discussed.

Spring Regional meetings were reviewed and discussed.

The 2015 Kiwanis International Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana was discussed. It was decided to not have a District breakfast at the convention given the cost of doing so.

Clubs not paying dues for 2014-15 were discussed. Those clubs are Ebensburg, Somerset and Kingston (which paid dues but not the convention registration fee of \$75.00).

Kiwanis day at Citizens Bank Park was discussed. See pages p88.

Discussion on District policies on background checks took place in light of Pennsylvania Act 153 of 2014. After discussion, the District board, by proper motion, second and vote, adopted a procedure that requires all Pennsylvania District Officers, Lt. Governors, District Chairs and Committees to have the necessary background checks as required by Act 153. See page p89-p90 for the approved procedure.

Discussion on what recommendations and policies as Act 153 relates to clubs and members. Potential procedures and policies that a club might adopt will be provided to clubs and can be seen as page p91-p92.

A proposal to extend the District office lease was considered. See page p95-p96 for a copy of that proposed lease extension. The lease agreement was approved as presented.

In conjunction with the Kiwanis International directive that all District's must be adopt the new form of District bylaws, a review of the new standard form of District bylaws took place. Lead by District Laws and Regulations Chair Matt Wise, the board reviewed the new proposed standard form of District bylaws. After review, the District board adopted a new form of District Bylaws subject to approval by Kiwanis International and the House of Delegates at the 2015 District Convention.

In conjunction with the Bylaw review/discussion, a review was conducted of the District Policy Code. Under the direction of Matt Wise, the board reviewed the policy code. After review, the District board approved a new revised District policy code subject to the adoption of the new District bylaws. The new District Policy Code can be seen as pages A1-A17.

Work on a new strategic plan is waiting for direction from Kiwanis International which, hopefully, is coming after the April Kiwanis International Board meeting.

With Kate Feryo unable to attend the meeting, no report and recommendations could be provided on awards. It was reported that the committee has been working on this subject.

The Keystone Kiwanian and the Keystone Kiwanian Editor were discussed. Governor-elect Jen presented information for the board's consideration. Governor Bob Raub reported that District Public Relations Chair Kristina Badali is working on proposal. After discussion, a motion was approved to have Jen Vare work with Kristina Badali to have a final proposal/plan ready for the July 18, 2015 District Board meeting.

The District Foundation nominating committee work is progressing and there should be no issue having a slate of candidates available by the deadline of June 28th.

Key Leader District Chair Stef Stamatopoulos indicated that the Key Leader program on April 24-26, 2015 is sold out. Stef is looking forward to a great weekend.

Information was shared on the KC Graduate program by SLP Alumni Chair Stef Stamatopoulos. See pages p97-p99.

Past Governor Cathy Szymanski has decided to that she would like to serve Pennsylvania by being a candidate for Kiwanis International Trustee and is seeking endorsement of the Pennsylvania District Board of Trustees. After hearing from Cathy, the District board voted, by proper motion and second, to endorse her for the position of Kiwanis International Trustee.

A discussion took place on the possibility, as some other Districts have done, of Pennsylvania submitting a resolution that would commit the District to reaching its 1.9 million dollar target for Eliminate as established by Kiwanis International. No action was taken.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The second meeting of the 2014-15 District Board of Trustees was held on January 31, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Bob Raub presided. The meeting was called at 9:30AM

The invocation was provided by Trustee Ann Graves

All board members were present.

Guests included Jeff Rose, Matt Wise, Bill Henning, Mike Coolbaugh, Darlene Anderson, Ben Osterhout and Tracy Smith.

Region VI Trustee Megan Kuffa has submitted a letter of resignation. That letter of resignation was accepted.

Candidates to replace Megan Kuffa were solicited and two Kiwanians have submitted the proper forms to be candidates. They are Mike Coolbaugh of Wyoming Area and Jeff Rose of Allentown Northeast. Both candidates addressed the board. After consideration, the board selected Mike Coolbaugh and Mike was immediately seated as Region VI Trustee.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages marked 14-23)

(Note: This portion of the meeting actually occurred at 1:00PM)

Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski spoke to the board via a phone call.

Growth in existing clubs was discussed. An incentive contest is being developed to help spur existing club growth.

New clubs were discussed. Efforts are underway or have been discussed in Warrington, Norristown, East Norriton, Back Mountain, Reading, Columbia and Hughsville.

The need for action and urgency now was discussed.

Consent Agenda (See the pages marked 24-57)

The items on the consent agenda were considered. The board approved all items on the consent agenda.

Comments were made by guests present.

Discussion and Action items

Extensive discussion and review of the 2013-14 & 2014-15 budgets took place. See pages the pages marked 57A to 59.

Review of District investments and account balances took place. The investment report and account balances are on the pages marked 60-65.

The District Holiday party was reviewed. The financial report on the 2014 party is on the page marked 67 with the page marked 68 offering a comparison from 2013.

The District Super Raffle was discussed with a focus on plans for the 2015 raffle sale. See the page marked 69 for a report.

The District shirt sale was discussed.

Extensive discussion took place on vacant Trustee and Lt. Governor positions for 2015-16. See the page marked 70.

Club officer training and the master instruction position and certified instructors were discussed. We need to fill the master instruction position. A candidate is considering accepting the position but has not yet committed. Discussion will take place between the Governor and Governor-elect on how to proceed.

A review took place on the 2015 Midwinter Conference registration and sponsorships.

Key Leader was discussed. See the page marked 77 for information on the 2015 Key Leader program. Conversation took place on the establishment of a western Pennsylvania Key Leader conference as well as potential changes to the overall Key Leader program. Any ideas and information on the conference should be shared with Key Leader Chair Stef Patounas.

Information was shared on the 2015 District Convention in Erie. See the pages marked 78-81.

Spring Regional meetings were discussed. See the page marked 82 for updated information.

The 2015 Kiwanis International in Indianapolis was discussed. Registration is now open. Discussion took place about having a District dinner or breakfast at the convention. After discussion, Executive Director Kevin Thomas was directed to explore having a breakfast in conjunction with the District Caucus on Thursday, June 25, 2015.

The clubs not paying dues for 2014-15 was reviewed. Please see pages marked 86A to 86C

2015-16 Board Meeting dates were discussed. See the page marked 87. The dates were approved as presented for 2015-16.

The location of the April 18, 2015 board will be the District office.

A report was provided on the Kiwanis Day at Citizens Bank Park/Philadelphia Phillies. See the page marked 88. The report was accepted as presented.

Background checks and the District policy were discussed in light of the recent changes enacted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. There was considerable discussion about what can and should be the Kiwanis approach and policy moving forward. At the present time, no action was possible because of all the uncertainties surrounding the implementation of this new law. More review and discussion will be necessary before a new District policy can be implemented. The new law requires a policy be in place by July 1st.

The District office lease was discussed. See the pages marked 97 and 98. After the new lease proposal is received, the committee appointed to study this will reconvene and consider a new lease at the present location and what other options might be the best possible alternative for the District. The target for completing this will be April 18th.

Laws and Regulations Chair Matt Wise provided a report on the process to update the District Board Bylaws and policies in accordance with the new Kiwanis International Standard Form of Bylaws. See the pages marked 98A to 98F. The target to get the bylaw portion of this done is April 18, 2015. The revised/new bylaws will be adopted at the District Convention in Erie.

At the last meeting District Governor-elect Jen Vare was assigned the task of reviewing the District Strategic Plan and beginning the process of making revisions necessary to make the plan measurable and relevant. However, Governor-elect Jen was told at Governor-elect training that all Districts will be asked to adopt a plan based on the new Kiwanis International Strategic plan; information and a template will be sent on this from Kiwanis International in the near future. Accordingly, Governor-elect Jen is recommending we not proceed in revising our current plan and instead we wait for the information to come from Kiwanis International. Governor Raub indicated, and the board agreed, that was a sound path to follow at this time and Governor-elect Jen is to keep us informed on what comes from Kiwanis International.

A report was provided on District Awards. See pages marked 100 - 101. After review and discussion, Governor Raub asked Trustee Kate Feryo to continue with this review by bringing others on her committee and come back to the board at the April 18^{th} board meeting with specific recommendations.

The District Commonwealth of Pennsylvania License Plate program was reviewed. A report is on the page marked 102. By proper motion, second and vote, the recommendation in the report was accepted.

The Keystone Kiwanian was discussed and reviewed. Also considered were budget constraints and issues related to its publication. After consideration and discussion, it was decided by proper motion and vote that the current issue being developed would be the last under the current format and editor. The board was, also, directed to consider and develop thoughts on the future direction and format of the Keystone Kiwanian and come to the next meeting with thoughts and recommendations on its future direction.

The District Foundation nominating committee was discussed. Governor-elect Jen Vare was appointed by Governor Bob Raub to chair this committee, organize a committee and carry out the duties of the committee in accordance with the District bylaws and policy.

At the last board meeting, the board had voted to provide no time on the convention agenda for the Past Lt. Governors Association meeting. PLGA president Darlene Anderson addressed the board on this decision and provided written information which can be viewed as the pages marked 103-104. After Darlene's presentation, a motion was introduced, seconded and approved to rescind the motion approved at the September 27, 2014 board meeting and provide time for the PLGA to have its meeting during the convention.

A proposal from the Kiwanis club of Hanover for a special dinner celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Kiwanis was discussed. See the page marked 106 for more information. After discussion by the board, it was agreed that we would offer support to disseminate information on the event but the District would not provide financial or planning support for the event, if it moves forward.

Trustees were reminded by Governor-elect Jen to start giving consideration for dates for the Governor's Official Visit/Fall Meetings.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 3:24 PM.

East Norriton and Norristown Recommendations

Last month I visited the East Norriton (Curves) club and then visited with Nan Odenthal of the Norristown School District.

The East Norriton meeting had 7 community members present. They are planning a gardening project for children in conjunction with the Norristown library. While I am not sure we can at this time match checks to applications, there are apparently at least 8 people committed to joining this club, perhaps more. We talked about an organizational meeting date of May 13th; however that date may need to be pushed back. Concern was expressed about having two club efforts going on so close together (East Norriton and Norristown).

I then visited, without appointment, Nan Odenthal, Grants and Public Relations Manager of the Norristown Area School District. The whole situation is somewhat muddled here but based on the conversation I had with Nan, here is how I understand the situation. There are at least 3 paid members for a potential Norristown club, Nan and the Superintendent of the school district among them. The Norristown School District has an after school program, funded by State grants, aimed at promoting academic and civic excellence. They have a program at each of the 9 schools in the district (2 high schools, 3 middle schools, 4 elementary schools). They want to add a service element to the program at each building and they want that effort to be Kiwanis SLP programs. They feel they must do all 9 at the same time. Potentially, the School District would have all 9 of the teachers that run the program at each school join Kiwanis, with the grant money for the program paying \$85.00 of each teachers dues (Apparently, Nan was left with the impression that is all they would need to pay with others paying more (\$150.00) as well as some "fund raising" done to offset that fact that \$101.00 needs to go to Kiwanis International and the District). Apparently also, the impression was left that 9 new SLP clubs were possible all at once and initial and ongoing costs of doing so were not brought up with the exception that any costs would be handled by a June fundraiser the King of Prussia club is conducting. Nan apparently learned of some of these costs later at a meeting she attended with Jen Vare, Kate Feryo and Lillian Mattja present. I was left the impression that Nan and school district very much want a Kiwanis club and very much want the SLP clubs but want to know how the costs might be handled.

So in order to expand Kiwanis, our SLP's and deliver on promises made in order preserve the good name of Kiwanis, here are my recommendations.

- Between the East Norriton Curves and Norristown school District, we apparently have at least 11 committed members. I am recommending we merge the two efforts. We will open a club in East Norriton with a satellite in the Norristown School District. I suggest we target a mid-June organizational date to have the members we need and the organizational meeting conducted.
- 2. Someone have a conversation with Jim Zinkand about how much the King of Prussia club will be covering of the initial cost of starting 9 SLP clubs (about \$3,000) and that annual cost of doing so.
- 3. Once we have a written dollar figure commitment from KOP, we figure out, if necessary, where we come up with the additional funds that would allow Norristown to open 9 SLP clubs in September.

Report to District Board April 18, 2015

- The Committee, as instructed by the District Board, began a review of the new standard form
 for District Bylaws as approved by Kiwanis International. The review consisted of conforming
 the existing bylaws to the new standard form, incorporating the required information, and
 determining what, if anything, that exists in the current bylaws should be migrated to the
 District Policy Code.
- 2. The Committee was also required to review the minutes from the District Board of Trustees from 2000 until present to determine what board actions should be officially written into the Policy Code. A special thanks to Governor-elect Jen Vare who reviewed 15 years of meeting minutes to determine those items. These referred items were then written into the Policy Code draft.
- 5. The Committee, in conjunction with Executive Director Kevin Thomas, reviewed the existing policy code and recommends several items also be removed from the code.
- 4. At the meeting, the Committee will present a complete package consisting of the draft form of the new standard form for District Bylaws in addition to a proposed Policy Code (with additions and deletions) and request recommendations and final approval by the District Board.

SLP and Alumni Coordinator's Report to District Board

K-Family Graduates

We are continuing to evaluate the implementation of a K-Family Graduates program for SLP alumni.

Max Williams, KC Graduate Program Administrator for the Rocky Mountain District, recommended that the program be implemented as a separate program within our District (as has been done in RMD) to allow graduates two options: the alumni network (relatively passive) and a K-Family graduates program (active participation with Kiwanis required).

During our conversations, Max also identified the challenges of implementing such a program including: the large amount of administrative work involved, most participants only electing to participate for one year, and relatively limited involvement (25-30 participants each year).

Despite these challenges, he still suggested that the program has great potential. In two years, it has been responsible for two new Circle K Clubs, about 27 new Circle K members, and approximately 8 new Kiwanis members in various Kiwanis Club all over the country.

Alumni Network

Our existing alumni network continues to grow. We are working to add the registration form to the PA Key Club and PA Circle K websites. The next scheduled correspondence with network members will be sent in early May and will include an invitation to the Second Annual LSSP will be held on August 13, 2015 in Erie as a part of the District Convention.

Thank you to those that worked to promote the program and identified future student leaders that will benefit from attending. Additional information/comments:

- As stated in the last report, the focus of this board and Kiwanis Committee has been a continued adjustment of the program towards improvement and modernization.
 - Club Officer Training: We are just days away from launching our on-line training video to clubs. The final production edits are taking place right now. Our District has invested approximately \$2.000 into this venture. A link to this training video will be shared with Kiwanis leadership as soon as it is made available to clubs.
 - The District Board will begin what is expected to be a two year process of making changes to the LTG election process to allow for on-line voting when attempts for in-person voting runs into issues which do not allow for

- an election to take place as result of quorum or weather. This process is just beginning and there is no further information to share yet.
- As Kevin reported in an email earlier this month. Key Club District Convention ended financially in the black. This is two years in a row now that we have avoided substantial losses on our convention program and needed the help of Kiwanis to bail us out. This year was particularly impressive since it was held at one of the more, if not most, expensive venues and we were struggling with attendance up until the week of the convention. As we look toward the future we believe we should be able to keep this positive financial planning going. However, attendance lies at the heart of our future progress. Plans will begin to be formed to address attendance growth this year.
- Also regarding District Convention, the event itself worked out very well. The students put together a highly attended and much enjoyed "Meet and Serve" where members from around the District had the opportunity to meet each other and raise money for K.C. Cash. This is a student funded, student managed scholarship program that allows for financial assistance to members who wish to attend convention but are restricted from doing so because of financial hardship. Members were treated to a wide variety of very instructional workshops and well attended caucuses where they listened to candidate speeches and asked questions of those running for District office. At House of Delegates, there were no changes to the By-Laws, just election of district leadership. Overall there were 43 clubs in attendance with total attendance just over 500 individuals.

1. Describe your region new club building activities:

New club building in Region 4 continues to be inadequate. Division 12 North is best at looking for new club opportunities; Liberty Kiwanis continues as their success story. All Region 4 Lieutenant Governors are seeking new club possibilities, and advocate for them at Division and Region inter-clubs and conferences.

2. Describe your region activities to support and strengthen existing clubs:

Division 12N has shown the most growth recently, thanks largely to its LTGs. 12S LTG Shirley McPherrin is very active in contacting her clubs, by visits and frequent messages and division news. She has begun an incentive program for recruiting new members. 14 LTGs Paige and Allan Michael continue in their final year as co-LTGs, and are trying to find ways to help their smallest and most struggling clubs. All Region 4 LTGs know that they have clubs in trouble, with low and declining membership, and some below charter strength.

3. Describe education activities in your region:

Region 4 has successful live CLE Workshops each summer, and expects to have another one this coming July or August, probably again in Lewisburg. We have session facilitators for Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers. 2015-16 club officers are encouraged to complete their annual online CLE training by the end of June. All Region 4 clubs have the most recent (2014) CLE materials.

See Paragraph 5 below concerning the Region 4 Spring Conference.

4. What is your region doing to support youth/SLP?

Kiwanis clubs' relationships with their sponsored Service Leadership Programs are receiving substantial emphasis in the PA District, and there needs to be more emphasis in Region 4 on improving these relationships. Club relationships with their SLPs vary around the Region: some are excellent, and some need to improve. Clubs inviting Key Club and Circle K members to their division inter-clubs does happen, and there needs to be more such interaction. Buffalo Valley AM Kiwanis is involved in Camp SETEBAID, a camp experience for children with diabetes. It is held each summer, and is always very successful. It draws significant support from Kiwanians around Division 12S, including on-scene volunteers. Mifflinburg Kiwanis joined with their Key Club in their semi-annual highway cleanup in October, 2014, and will again in May, 2015. Mifflinburg continues its program of members reading to young children.

Division 125 Key Clubbers form an important part of Kisses for Kids; see Paragraph 5 below. They are the best solicitors of donations.

5. What should the board be aware of in your region?

The Region 4 Spring Conference will be held May 2, 2015, again at the Foss Home at Gelsinger Medical Center in Danville. Our guest speaker will be Judith Jones, Executive Director, Susquehanna Valley CASA: Court Appointed Special Advocates, who represent children in court cases. Other speakers will be

Region 6 Trustee Mike Coolbaugh, District Youth Protection Manager, who will speak on the new Pennsylvania child protection law effective July 1, 2015, and District Governor Bob Raub, who will deliver his Governor's Message. Governor's Gifts from the clubs will go to the Eliminate Project. Division 12S held a very successful annual Kisses For Kids the weekend of February 13-15, 2015 at the Susquehanna Valley Mall in Selinsgrove. The event benefits the Children's Miracle Network (CMN) at Janet Weis Children's Hospital at Geisinger. LTG Shirley McPherrin organizes it. 12S Kiwanians and Key Clubbers staff the tables. The event involves more than 30,000 Hershey Kisses. We ask for a one-dollar donation for a bag of ten Kisses. This year the event raised just over \$2400.00.

12S LTG McPherrin and LTG-Elect Jean (Mimi) Dow have agreed to continue in their respective offices for the year 2015-16. This continuity will be of significant benefit to that division. The Division Election will be at an inter-club either April 22 or May 18.

6. Other information for the Board:

Bill Henning of Bald Eagle and Nittany Valleys Kiwanis will succeed this writer as Region 4 Trustee for the term 2015-18. He will assist in facilitating the May 2 Regional Spring Conference.

Division 12N's LTGs are in place for 2015-16, and one will continue in 2016-17.

Division 125's combined inter-clubs continue to work well.

Montoursville Kiwanis hosted an inter-club February 2, 2015, to benefit the Children's Miracle Network. As their Kiwanis One Day project, three Kiwanis Clubs in the Lewisburg area assisted with food packing at a "Feed the Hungry" event in Lewisburg April 11, 2015.

Towanda-Wysox Kiwanis will host an inter-club in Towanda April 23, 2015.

Bald-Eagle and Nittany Valleys Kiwanis will host a "Speakeasy Interclub Bash - Roaring 20s" May 13, 2015. The speaker will be Past District Governor Susan Gräb.

Executive Director's Report - April 18, 2015

- The most recent Midwinter conference was one of best ever based on the evaluations and comments made. Governor Bob Raub's decision to include Gavin Jerome as a feature of the program had a large role in this. The Penn Stater had a large role in the success. So too did the many workshop presenters. It would be my recommendation that we return to the Penn Stater for 2017 and 2018.
- 2. We will be discussing Background checks and youth protection. I would urge we adopt the most simple and straightforward policies we are able and as they relate to Pennsylvania law. More importantly when talking to clubs, we should embrace the need for these checks and policies. If we dwell on the negatives and the problems associated with this, we will create a culture of negativity that will not serve any constructive purpose as it relates to our mission for serving children. Since several people told me it was a good response, I am enclosing my response to a Kiwanian that made an inquiry to the District office.
- 3. The Pennsylvania District has not had representation on the Kiwanis International Board since Don Sanker left as trustee in 2010. It is time we end that period of direct non-representation. Because we work in co-operation with 5 other districts in the northeast United States, the earliest we can have a candidate is 2017. I suggest we have a strong, qualified candidate that the entire district will enthusiastically support ready to run at the 2017 International Convention.
- 4. In case you did not know, Key Club has taken on Early Childhood Development and Learning as its youth serving youth project. Enclosed you will find their Call to Action.
- 5. I am concerned about the future viability of a standalone Circle K District convention in its present format. There are various factors but they all come down to financial viability and hotel contracts. Unless a significant increase occurs in attendance in the next year or two, it may be necessary to hold the Circle K Convention at the same time and location as the Key Club Convention or the Kiwanis Midwinter and/or change the format of the convention to shorten its length.
- We need all board members to support the District Super Raffle and to try to sell tickets.

I am, also, including my travel schedule for January, February and March.

As always, feel free to write or call any time your need assistance, have questions or concerns.

Thank you for all each of you do for Kiwanis.

Thanks for your inquiry.

The Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International is not and cannot mandate background checks for all Kiwanians.

However the requirements for background checks for volunteers in Pennsylvania has changed significantly and dramatically as the result of legislation passed and signed in December. Many situations that previously may not have required background checks for volunteers working with children now do. Attached please find information that provides more information.

Obviously as this is the law in Pennsylvania. Kiwanis clubs and Kiwanians have no choice but to comply. However given the legacy of Jerry Sandusky and other high profile child abuse incidents in Pennsylvania and given our mission to children. Kiwanians should embrace these requirements since they provide additional protection for children and youth.

The District board will be meeting on April 18. 2015 and will be coming out with guidelines/recommendations for all clubs and Kiwanians to follow as it relates to this law; we have already been educating Kiwanians about the new law. However, the simplest solution for any club, as it relates to the requirements of this law, is to have all members, both current and any perspective new members, complete the required background checks. Then there are no "what if" or "how about this scenario" to consider. Several clubs (among them Erie, Chambersburg, Wyoming area) have already adopted this practice; I think more will follow. The District will be requiring all Lt. Governors. District Officers and anyone else holding a position on the District level to have these checks.

In the world of five or ten years ago, we probably would not have had to have this discussion. Thanks to the sad legacy of people in strong positions of trust, that world is gone. But as I said before given our mission to children, it is my opinion that Kiwanis clubs and children should welcome these changes not oppose them.

If I can answer additional questions, please let me know.



I am anxious to see the numbers of hours of service and different types of projects completed in order to fully understand the impact. 

District Shirt Update

- Currently 43 shirts on hand (see inventory sheet enclosed)
- Approximately \$110.00 was earned for the Midwinter conference from the shirts sold there (Price of shirt sold there vs. cost of shirts from supplier).
- At this time we are seeing a gain/profit of \$4.00 on the shirts as a District fundraiser. This is because of having to pay for all the shirts we ordered. The cost of those shirts, less the cost of those sold at Midwinter, went against shirt sales.
- All shirts sold between now and District convention will go to bottom line (profit) until such time as we have to replenish inventory. This would include any orders for International Convention and District Convention Preorders.
- Inventory replenishment costs will be immediately debited against shirt sales with appropriate adjustments made for shirts sold at convention and conferences.
- Shirts sold at District Convention will be credited to District Convention sales. The cost of those shirts will, also, be debited to convention.
- We now have a handle on shipping costs: If we use USPS, the shipping and handling charge is \$5.00 for one shirt, \$6.00 for two in the same order, \$7.00 for three, etc.

lenjoyed the one day format. Breakfast should have been set up during check in at 8:00.


Almost everyone here was white. Do we try to get any black or other races to join Kiwanis? There is a lot of talk about forming new clubs, but what about clubs with low membership?

Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International Criminal History Background Checks and Clearances

POLICY

To ensure the highest standard of leadership and to ensure that adults working with youth are of the utmost moral fiber, the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International requires clear criminal history background checks and clearances for all District Board Members, Regional Trustees, Lieutenant Governors, and District Chairs as part of the eligibility criteria to hold such positions. In addition, the Pennsylvania District requires clear criminal history background checks and clearances for all Kiwanians and for non-members (such as District Chairs and administrators and their assistants or committee members) working on behalf of the District with youth under age 18 and for all adults – both Kiwanians and non-members – registered for, participating in, or staying overnight at any event organized by the District involving youth under age 18.

A criminal history background check is considered "not clear" if it indicates a felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude; a felony or conviction or registration of a violent and/or sexual nature; a felony or conviction or registration involving any type of abuse of a child, involving threatening or intimidating behavior, or otherwise of a physical nature; or a felony related to larceny or theft. (Reference Commonwealth of Pennsylvania House Bill 435/Act 153 of 2014) Other types of felony convictions will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the District Youth Protection Manager. Any conviction legally reversed or overturned by the proper authorities shall not be considered when evaluating background checks and clearances.

Successful completion of background checks and clearances (a "clear check") is based on verification that none of the above and none of the convictions prohibited in any Pennsylvania District or Kiwanis International policies or similar thereto have been determined for that person. A clear check is necessary to be an eligible candidate for Pennsylvania District Board membership; thus, candidates must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager before elections are held. District appointees must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager before assuming the appointed position. Adults working with youth as stated above must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager prior to arrival at the District event.

The Pennsylvania District recognizes only the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's criminal history background check/clearance process as valid. All background checks shall be reviewed and evaluated by the District Youth Protection Manager and determined to be clear or not clear, based on the criteria stated above. The District Executive Director shall be advised if a check indicates a problem or concern that requires further investigation or is determined to be not clear. In either case, the District Youth Protection Manager shall notify the individual in question. A check that is not clear causes automatic denial of the right to hold the position or attend the event in question.

The District Board shall have final authority on the matter.

Background checks are valid for a period of 36 months. All relevant persons as noted previously who have not had the necessary criminal history background checks and clearances and have not been verified as clear within the last 36 months at any given time are required to submit current criminal history background checks and clearances documentation.

Each individual subject to a background check/clearance shall be responsible for obtaining the background check/clearance, submitting the results to the District Youth Safety Manager, and paying the related fees. Checks and clearances shall be conducted as inexpensively as reasonably possible to ensure accurate results.

Members of the community who attend Kiwanis Pennsylvania District events as guests and who are not responsible for the welfare of a child other than their own, or do not have direct routine interaction with children other than their own, are not subject to this policy. However, the Pennsylvania District reserves the right to

refuse any individual the right to participate in a District-sponsored activity if the person is known to possess a criminal history as defined in this policy.

Candidates for any District Board position or District appointment will be considered disqualified as a candidate for such office.			
	C. Adults wishing to participate in District youth events will not be allowed to do so.D. Conduct unbecoming process may be engaged depending on convictions identified in the report.			



Wyoming Area Kiwanis Club Criminal History Background Checks and Clearances

POLICY

To ensure the highest standard of membership and to ensure that adults working with youth are of the utmost moral fiber, the Kiwanis Club of Wyoming Area requires clear criminal history background checks and clearances for all current/prospective members as part of the eligibility criteria of membership. Membership applicants will not be approved or allowed to participate in any Wyoming Area Kiwanis events involving youth under age 18 until documentation of a clear criminal history background has been submitted to the Club Youth Protection Manager. Current members who have not yet submitted documentation of a clear criminal history background will not be allowed to participate in Wyoming Area Kiwanis events involving youth under age 18 and will not be eligible to renew their membership until such documentation is provided.

The Wyoming Area Kiwanis Club requires clear criminal history background checks and clearances for all Kiwanians and for non-members volunteering for or participating in activities involving youth under age 18 on behalf of the club. A criminal history background check is considered "not clear" if it indicates a felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude; a felony or conviction or registration of a violent and/or sexual nature; a felony or conviction or registration involving any type of abuse of a child, involving threatening or intimidating behavior, or otherwise of a physical nature; or a felony related to larceny or theft. (Reference Act 153 of 2014) Other types of felony convictions will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the Club Youth Protection Manager. Any conviction legally reversed or overturned by the proper authorities shall not be considered when evaluating background checks and clearances. Successful completion of background checks and clearances (a "clear check") is based on verification that none of the above and none of the convictions prohibited in any Wyoming Area Kiwanis Club, Pennsylvania Kiwanis District or Kiwanis International policies or similar thereto have been determined for that person.

A clear check is necessary to be an eligible candidate for election to the Wyoming Area Kiwanis Board; thus any member wishing to serve on the Board must submit documentation of a clear check to the Club Youth Protection Manager before elections are held.

The club recognizes only the most current Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Act 153 legislation regarding criminal history background checks and clearances as valid. All background checks shall be reviewed and evaluated by the Club Youth Protection Manager and determined to be clear or not clear, based on the criteria stated above. The Club President shall be advised if a check indicates a problem or concern that requires further investigation or is determined to be not clear. In either case, the Club Youth Protection Manager shall notify such person. A check that is not clear causes automatic denial of membership in the club. Current members who receive a check determined as not clear will not be allowed to participate in Wyoming Area Kiwanis events involving youth under age 18 and will not be eligible to renew their membership.

The Club Board shall have final authority on the matter.

Background checks are valid for a period of 36 months. All members who have not had the necessary criminal history background checks and clearances and have not been verified as clear within the last 36 months at any given time are required to submit current criminal history background checks and clearances.

Each individual subject to a background check shall be responsible for obtaining the background check, submitting the results to the Club Youth Safety Manager, and paying the related fees. Checks shall be conducted as inexpensively as reasonably possible to ensure accurate results.

Members of the community who attend Wyoming Area Kiwanis events as guests and who are not responsible for the welfare of a child other than their own, or do not have direct routine interaction with children other than their own, are not subject to this policy. However, the Wyoming Area Kiwanis reserves the right to refuse any individual the right to participate in a club-sponsored activity if the person is known to possess a criminal history as defined in this policy.

LEASE EXTENSION AGREEMENT

This Lease Extension Agreement is made and entered into this ____ day of May 2015, by and between Blue Mountain Properties, LLC, hereinafter called Lessor, and Kiwanis, hereinafter called Lessee,

- 1. The Lessee intends to extend their current lease with the Lessor, for the Leased Premises, as constituting Suite 12 of the property situated at 2793 Old Post Road, Susquehanna Township, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, to be used as general office space, file/records storage space and uses normally incident thereto and for no other purpose. Lessor and Lessee agree to extend the current lease agreement as previously executed with exception to Section 2. Rent, Section 10. Option To Extend, and Section 18. Escalation. These sections of the previous lease shall be amended upon the execution of this extension agreement. The term of this lease extension agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing October 1, 2015 and ending September 30, 2018.
- 2. Rent. Lessee agrees to pay and shall pay rent to Lessor at 2793 Old Post Road, Suite 101, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, or at such other place as the Lessor shall designate in writing, as rent for the Leased Premises, payable without demand and without setoff or deduction, except as expressly provided herein, in advance on the first (1st) day of each calendar month commencing on October 1, 2012.
 - (a) For each month in rental year October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2015, the rental amount will be \$1,500.00 per month.
- 10. Option to Extend. The Lessee shall have an option to extend the term of this Lease for a period of three (3) years to begin upon the expiration of this Lease Extension Agreement. All terms and provisions in effect during the last year of this Lease, except for the rental amount, shall apply to such extended term, provided that the Lessee is not in default at the end of this three (3) year extension. Such option shall be executed by giving written notice to the Lessor at least ninety (90) days prior to the termination of this Lease. At such time as this option is exercised by the Lessee, the rental rate shall continue to escalate for the duration of the extension as defined under Section 18 Escalation.

In the event Lessee does not renew or extend the term of this Lease as herein provided and holds over beyond the expiration of the Lease term, such holding over shall be deemed a month-to-month tenancy on the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Lease, except that the rental rate shall continue to escalate at the rate of five percent (5%) per year for each year during such hold-over term, until the tenancy is terminated in a manner provided by law.

18. ESCALATION. The LESSEE shall pay to the LESSOR as additional rent for each month of the rental year beginning October 1, 2016, and each month of each rental year thereafter, an amount computed as follows:

- (b) For each month in rental year October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017 \$1,500.00 multiplied by (CPI-U for September 1, 2016 minus CPI-U for September 1, 2015) divided by (CPI-U for September 1, 2015);
- (c) For each month in rental year October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018 \$1,500.00 multiplied by (CPI-U for September 1, 2017 minus CPI-U for September 1, 2015) divided by (CPI-U for September 1, 2015);

The CPI-U is the index factor calculated by the United States Department of Labor for all Urban Consumers (Base Year 1982-84 all items = 100). In the event that the CPI-U (or a successor or substitute index) is not available, a reliable governmental (or other non-partisan publication) calculation shall be used to replace the CPI-U for purposes of computing the escalation during the course of this Lease.

Under no circumstances shall the applicable base monthly rent, be lower than the initial base monthly rent for the preceding year. Also, in no event shall the base rent amount adjustment be increased by more than five percent (5%) a year.

PENNSYLVANIA DISTRICT KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL

POLICY CODE

I. GENERAL:

A. General Provisions:

Any changes, additions or deletions to these rules as may be deemed necessary shall be made by approval of majority of the Board of Directors and become operative upon approval.

B. Correspondence:

Copies of all letters and other communications issued to Clubs by Governor, Governor-Elect or Lt. Governors concerning club reports, conventions, delegates, District indebtedness, and other matters of record, shall be submitted to the District Office.

C. District Emblem:

To preserve the distinction and dignity of the Pennsylvania District emblem, it shall not be used for trade or commercial purposes without specific authorization of the Board of Directors. The emblem my appear on District badges for present and past District officers and District committee chairmen and District, Division and Club programs, bulletins, stationery and publications connected with Kiwanis programs and activities of a noncommercial nature. No other use shall be permitted without prior approval from the District Board pursuant to written request submitted to the District Executive Director at least ten (10) days prior to the next meeting of the Board.

D. Use of District Mailing List:

The Pennsylvania District Mailing list shall be used only for official District purposes subject to the following exceptions only, and no other:

- (1) Any organization or associate that offers a speaker Bureau or other meeting and/or program services.
- (2) Prior approval by majority vote of the District Board of Trustees.

E. Elections

(1) List of delegates:

The list of delegates shall not be available to any group or individual prior to or during the convention for any purpose other than those necessary to the completion of District convention business.

(2) Candidates:

Any club or Division in the District desiring to nominate a candidate for the office of District Governor or District Governor-Elect for the ensuring administrative year shall file a written statement of intent with the District Executive Director no later than May 31. A candidate for Governor-Elect or a candidate for Governor, shall deliver to the District Executive Director a statement or brochure, limited to an 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of paper containing biographical data and the qualifications of the candidate, which is

subscribed to by the candidate signifying his/her willingness to accept and fulfill all responsibilities of the office if elected. The statement of intent shall be delivered to the District Executive Director in sufficient quantities to send one to each club in the District and provide fifty (50) additional copies for the office use and shall be accompanied by a 5" x 7" black and white glossy photograph suitable for printing in the Keystone Kiwanian. As soon as possible after receipt of the statement of intent and no later than thirty (30) days prior to the Convention at which the election shall take place, the District Executive Director shall mail a copy of the statement to each club in the District.

F. Officers and Chairmen Hold One Position Only:

A member shall hold only one Club office or chairmanship at a time to provide maximum effort and leadership service.

The District Bylaws prescribe general areas of responsibility for District Officers and District Committee Chairmen and Kiwanis International instructions and bulletins give additional guidelines.

A member shall hold only one District office or chairmanship at a time with the exception of those positions where the member, by reason of holding a particular office, is chairman of a committee ex-officio. A District chairman shall not serve as District chairman and zone chairman of the same or other committee simultaneously.

G. Sponsorship of Kiwanis Tours and Trips:

The Pennsylvania District shall limit sponsorship of tours and organized trips to those primarily within the continental limits of the United States and in conjunction with participation and attendance at major Kiwanis activities such as conventions.

Sponsorship of tours and organization trips by the Pennsylvania District shall require prior approval of the plans and arrangements by the District Board of Directors.

A full financial report and payment of all net proceeds shall be tended to the District Executive Director's office within thirty (30) days after completion of the activity by the trip chairman.

H. Use of professional fund raisers:

The Pennsylvania District does not recommend the use of professional fundraisers by any Kiwanis club in the District.

I. Appropriation of Club or District Equipment:

The practice of appropriating District or Club banners, gongs and other equipment is disapproved by the Pennsylvania District.

II. PROTOCOL:

A. Charter Presentation:

(1) Charter presentation meetings, being a Kiwanis International function, shall be preappoved by the District Governor.

(2) It is recommended that the Lt. Governor or their designate act as toastmaster and that the charter presentation and principal address be made by the District Governor or other District Officer as may be designated.

B. Installation of Officers:

It is the exclusive prerogative of each Lt. Governor to preside at and conduct the ceremonies for the "Installation of Officers" meeting of each club in the Division and no other person shall be invited to conduct said ceremonies unless the Lt. Governor shall expressly approved such invitation in advance.

C. Official District Functions:

The District Governor shall be the presiding officer at all District functions, except the installation ceremony for District Officers and any District Function honoring the Governor.

E. District Board Meetings:

District Board meetings will follow a consent agenda and action agenda in order to allow more time for strategic discussions.

An Action Follow-Up report will be issued immediately following board meetings in conjunction with all items requiring action as discussed during said meeting.

The following are the standing rules for District Board Meetings. These rules should only be enforced when necessary:

- 1. Only official members of the Board of Trustees of this District may make motions and vote on motions.
- 2. No person may speak more than three minutes at a time unless allowed to do so by the orders of the day or by a majority vote of the board.
- 3. No person may speak more than twice on the same question unless allowed to do so by a majority vote of the Board.
- 4. The maker of a motion shall be entitled to speak first in support of such motion or may immediately yield the floor to another board member.
- 5. A board member shall not speak either for or against a motion and on the same recognition move to close debate.
- 6. A motion which terminates debate on any main motion pending before the Board will not be in order until 10 minutes of debate has taken place or until no Board member seeks the floor. This minimum time requirement does not include time spent on amendments to the main motion or any other subsidiary motions.
- 7. At the discretion of the District Executive Director, certain routine items of business may be placed on a consent agenda, which shall be approved by a single motion and majority vote without debate. Any board member who wishes to remove an item from the Consent Agenda must make a written request to the District Executive Director prior to the commencement of the meeting.
- 8. Any of the above rules may be suspended by a majority vote.
- 9. Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority for all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the District bylaws or these standing rules.

III. DIVISION ACTIVITIES:

A. Division Councils:

The purposes of the District is primarily educationally and promotional. For administrative purposes it has been found advisable to divide the District into divisions which are not additional organization units, but are simply defined areas where the elected Lt. Governors assist the Governor.

Division councils composed of representatives of the clubs of the division may be convened by the Lt. Governor to discuss, consult on, and coordinate co-operative programs and activities for the clubs of the division. The Division Council shall promote the exchange of ideas and cooperation among the clubs without infringing on the authority of the independent clubs.

In addition the Division Council shall provide leadership, education and shall promote the programs of the Pennsylvania District and Kiwanis International.

B. Meetings:

(1) The number and place of meetings shall be determined by each Divisional Council according to local requirements. It is recommended that a minimum of four (4) meetings be held each year and when feasible or necessary, additional or monthly meetings may be held.

The presiding officer at Divisional Council meetings shall be the Lt. Governor, however, in emergencies, the immediate Past Lt. Governor or their predecessors shall preside. At the initial meeting of the Council, a division secretary and a division treasurer may be appointed by the Lt. Governor with the approval of a majority of the council members.

At Division Council meetings voting and motion privileges shall be limited to the Lt. Governor, the Lt. Governor-Elect, all Club Presidents and all Club Secretaries, and all Past Lt. Governors who are active members of a Kiwanis Club of the Division. Division Chairmen and other officers of the clubs of the division not previously named may attend council meetings and may address the council but shall not be entitled to make motions or vote.

(2) An agenda with appropriate opening and closing should be adopted.

The Division Council may with the full cooperation of the leadership of all the clubs, reach decisions for the mutual benefit of the entire division including requests for voluntary financial support. The council shall have no dues structure. No club in any division shall be obligated by any action taken at a Division Council.

Each Division should formulate written "Operating Procedures" as guidelines for the operation and continuity of its Division Council. The "Operating Procedures" shall be in harmony with the Bylaws and policies of Kiwanis International and the Pennsylvania District.

C. Redivisioning:

Proposals for redivisioning may be initiated at the club, division, region or district level. Redivisioning can occur as follows:

- (1) Split of an existing division into two or more divisions.
- (2) "Shift" of clubs between two or more divisions.
- (3) Consolidation of two or more divisions.
- (4) Any combination of the above.

The procedure to initiate redivisioning at the club or division level shall be as follows:

- (1) The Lt. Governors of the divisions effected by any redivision proposal shall give personal consideration to the proposal. Any proposal must include the reasons supporting the request and a list of the benefits which would result if the proposal were approved. Issues which should be taken into consideration include the ability of the new division (s), if any, to support a Lt. Governor with a sufficient number of members and the effect on Lt. Governor-Elects who have been elected to hold office during the next administrative year.
- (2) After review, the Lt. Governor (s) shall, following ten (10) days written notice to the President of each club of the division, call a conference for the purpose of discussion of the redivisioning proposal. Copies of the proposal shall be sent to all District Officers. The notice of the division conference shall contain the following information which shall be part of the proposal:
 - (a) Proposed territorial boundaries of the new divisions with a sketch or map showing the approximate location of each club.
 - (b) A list of club names and membership totals resulting from the redivisioning proposal.
 - (c) A list of any non-meeting clubs in the new division (s).
- (3) Delegates elected by the clubs to the division conference shall vote on the redivisioning proposal as instructed by a majority vote of their Board of Directors or by a majority vote of their members present and voting at a club meeting. Voting at the division conference shall be in accordance with the provisions of District Policy & Bylaws; however, any club unable to be represented by its own members at the division conference may submit its vote in writing provided that the Lt. Governor has received the written tally in sufficient time to be included with the results at the division conference.
- (4) Approval of any redivision proposal shall be by two-thirds vote of the clubs, in the division (s). Following any vote to approve redivision, the Lt. Governor (s) shall send the adopted proposal with the vote tally to all clubs in the division (s) and all District Officers. Such information shall be transmitted so that it will be received no later than December 31, of the current administrative years.
- (5) Proposals for redivision shall be reviewed by the District Board no later than March 1 of the current administrative year. It is recommended that any elections of Lt. Governors and Lt. Governor-Elect as outlined in the District Bylaws be deferred until after District Board review of any redivisioning proposal which would affect the results of such elections.

IV. MISCELLANEOUS

A. Official Color:

The official color of the Pennsylvania District shall be yellow.

B. Official Blazer:

The official blazer of the Pennsylvania District shall be Navy Blue.

C. Reporting by the District Foundation:

The District Foundation Board shall provide copies of its Annual Audit Report to the District Board of Trustees. The Foundation Board shall provide semi-annual reports of receipts and disbursements to the District Board of Trustees.

D. Line of Credit:

The District shall maintain a line of credit not to exceed \$40,000.00. The line of credit shall be used only for the budgeted operating expenses of the District.

- E. The Board of Trustees shall designate the official or officials who shall sign checks.
- F. The necessary traveling expenses of all district officers when engaged in the business of the district shall be paid by the district in accordance with the provisions of the budget.
- G. The necessary expenses of the Governor, Governor-elect and Executive Director incurred in attending any convention of Kiwanis International shall be paid by the district under the provisions of the approved budget.

V. DISTRICT POSITION ON THE DENIAL OF MEMBERSHIP APPLICATIONS

The Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis recognizes by the Constitution and Bylaws of Kiwanis International, the Pennsylvania District and all affiliated clubs, that the board of directors of a club has the right to reject any membership application submitted for its consideration.

However, the Pennsylvania District does not support and strongly discourages the rejection of any application on the basis of the gender, race or religious background of the applicant. We encourage and ask all clubs to accept or reject applicants without any consideration of the gender, race or religious background of the applicant.

VI. STRATEGIC PLANNING

The District shall have a strategic planning committee appointed by the District Governor and approved by the District Board of Trustees.

VII. SELECTION OF PENNSYLVANIA CANDIDATES FOR THE POSITION OF KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL TRUSTEE

When the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Political Action Committee determines that the District shall offer a candidate for the position of Kiwanis International Trustee, the name(s) of any member(s) of the district, who consent in writing, shall be presented to the District Convention. Such presentation will be sponsored

by the club(s) of such member(s). For a member to be presented, they must have held or are currently holding the office of Pennsylvania District Governor. A member, to be selected, must receive a majority of the votes of the members of the House of Delegates.

Prior to coming before the House of Delegates, any candidate(s) for the position of Trustee will make a presentation to a meeting of the Past District Governors which will be held at the District Convention prior to the House of Delegates. The Past District Governors shall determine the length of any presentation made to them and will be able to ask questions of any candidate(s). The Past Governors can endorse any and all candidates. The endorsement of any candidate(s) shall be announced to the House of Delegates when it is considering the candidates for the position of Kiwanis International Trustee.

All candidates for International Trustee will be provided the opportunity to address the District Convention for three minutes at the convention opening session. At the District Convention business session, they will be provided the opportunity to have a nominating speech of not more than two minutes and a seconding speech of not more than one minute. All candidates will be permitted to distribute campaign material during the convention in accordance with rules determined by the District Board of Trustees.

Nothing in these procedures would prevent the nomination of candidates from the floor of the convention.

VII. PROCEDURES FOR THE DISTRICT FOUNDATION NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The following will serve as a guideline for the appointment and operation/conduct of the District Foundation Nominating Committee.

- A. By not later than March 1st of the administrative year, the District Governor shall have appointed the District Foundation Nominating Committee in accordance with Article VII, Section 3, paragraph (h) of the District Bylaws and provide them with instruction on the duties of the committee.
- B. In accordance with Article VIII, Section 20, the District Foundation Nominating Committee shall select a slate of candidates to serve a three (3) year term as directors on the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation Board and to be submitted for election at the annual meeting of the District Foundation.
- C. The Nominating Committee shall hold at least one meeting of all members of the committee to discuss its responsibilities and develop a plan to meet those responsibilities.
- D. The Nominating Committee shall select at least one candidate for every term which will be expiring at the end of the administrative year and for any other vacancies on the Foundation Board of Directors.
- E. The Nominating committee will contact all potential nominees to the Foundation Board of Directors and get their assurance that they will serve and meet all responsibilities, if elected. The committee will not submit the names of anyone who has not been contacted and/or has not agreed to serve and meet all responsibilities. The committee should extend the courtesy of contacting all members of the Board whose terms are expiring and ask them whether they wish to be nominated for another term.

- F. The Chairman of the nominating committee will insure that all members of the committee shall receive the names of all Kiwanians whose names will be submitted for nomination. A majority of the committee must approve the list of nominees.
- G. Not less than 45 days prior to the start of the annual District Convention, the Chairman of the Committee shall report the names of all candidates approved by the committee to the District Governor and President of the District Foundation.
- H. The Foundation President or his/her designated representative will prepare a ballot showing the names of all Kiwanians submitted by the nominating committee. The ballot should list all candidates in alphabetical order and incumbents should be noted.
 - I. All members of the nominating committee will remain impartial and will not endorse or campaign for any of the nominees the committee develops.

VIX. Raffles and Games of Chance

For any District sponsored organization or club wishing to have a raffle which would solicit every club in the district and/or be sold at a District sponsored event, the following criteria must be met.

- I. Any Club or District sponsored organization (District Foundation, District Circle-K, District Key Club, Builders Club or Aktion Club) wishing to solicit all clubs in the District to participate in a raffle or game of chance or wishing to sell the same at a District convention, conference or event must get the approval of the District Board of Trustees to do so.
- 2. On any ticket for a raffle or game of chance, there must be a clear statement of purpose.

 Additionally, a clear statement must be made about where the proceeds should be sent or submitted.

 Additionally, a clear statement must be made on the time and location of the drawing or game. All tickets must be numbered for audit and control purposes.
- 3. An appropriate games of chance license must be obtained and approved by the appropriate government agency.

If the above criteria are not met, the following penalties may be applied.

- 1. Any Club or District sponsored organization failing to meet the above guidelines may receive a warning letter advising of the violations and asking them to immediately cease operation of the raffle or game of chance until corrective action can be and is taken. If a club fails to cease operation when required to do so, the District may request that Kiwanis International place the club's charter on suspended status. If a District sponsored organization fails to cease operation when required to do so, the District may seek the removal of the appropriate officers and/or the dissolution of the board of directors of the sponsored organization. If necessary, the appropriate government agency or agencies will be notified.
- 2. Any club or District sponsored organization conducting a raffle or game of chance at a convention or conference without following the above guidelines will be asked to cease operation immediately.

Failure to do so may result in the removal of those individuals representing the club or sponsored organization from the convention, conference or event.

X. Trustee and Lt. Governor Expense reimbursement and reporting

No Lt. Governor shall be eligible for general expense reimbursement if more than one of the required Lt. Governors' reports has not been submitted.

No Trustee or Lt. Governor shall be eligible for a hotel stipend expense reimbursement if they stay at an alternate hotel or lodging facility when rooms are available at the conference or convention designated hotel.

The annual convention stipend will be determined by dividing the money available by those Lt. Governors and Board Members who attended. Those who attended, but are not eligible because of missing reports will not receive the stipend and that money will remain undisbursed.

All Trustees who are visiting clubs in divisions with no Lt. Governors are eligible for the same mileage stipend as are Lt. Governors when they visit clubs in said divisions.

XI. Medical Costs of Members

The District will not establish a fund to help defray medical expenses of any Kiwanian.

XII. Conflict of Interest Statements

At the first official board meeting of each administrative year, each member of the District Board of Trustees shall complete and sign the District Conflict of interest statement.

XIII. Recognition Programs

The Kiwanis Heroes program, originally established at the 2002 District Convention, shall become a permanent recognition program of the District.

XIV. Region Elections

Process and procedure

- 1. The personnel of the conference shall be the president, president-elect and immediate past president of each club in the division, or their duly elected alternates, the Lieutenant Governor of the Division, all Past Governors, and all Past Lieutenant Governors still active, privileged, or senior members of a club of the region.
- 2. The representatives of one-third (1/3) of the clubs of the region shall constitute a quorum at the conference, and each club shall have one vote for each representative present but in no case shall any club be entitled to more than 3 voting delegates. At conference registration, a list shall be compiled with the name and club of each voting delegate. At least 1/3 of the clubs in the region must be represented with at least one representative to constitute a quorum and make the voting official. There will be no voting by proxy.
- 3. Voting delegates should be seated in an area designated for voting delegates only.
- 4. The Lieutenant Governors, Past Governors, and Past Lieutenant Governors in attendance at the conference shall have the privilege of speaking without the right to vote and may not represent or

vote for any club not represented by 3 delegates. Nothing in this section shall preclude a Lt. Governor, Past Governor or Past Lt. Governor from being one of the three delegates from the club in which they hold membership.

5. The meeting's presiding officer shall not be entitled to vote except in the case of a tie.

- 6. The District Board will designate who shall be the presiding officer. In the absence of the designated presiding officer, the conference shall elected one of its members who is not running off a trustee position as chairman. The conference shall elect one of its members as secretary and such tellers/vote counters as may be necessary.
- 7. Upon completion of the meeting organization as above outlined, the conference shall proceed to elect a trustee. The candidates for Trustee shall be those candidates who have been nominated by their club and division and have filed the appropriate nomination form by March September 15th with the District Office. The District Executive Director shall provide a list of all official candidates and that list shall be provided to all voting delegates at the time of registration. Nominations from the floor shall be permitted but all nominees from the floor must submit the required nomination form to the presiding officer of the meeting prior to the call for nominations. No person shall be submitted to the conference as a candidate for Trustee without the consent of said person first being obtained. Each candidate for trustee shall give assurance that he/she will fulfill the duties and responsibilities of trustee.
- 8. All nominees for office shall have a Kiwanian provide a nomination of not more than 2 minutes and a Kiwanian provide a seconding speech of not more than 1 minute. After the nomination and seconding speech, each candidate will have not more than 2 minutes to address the meeting.
- 9. When more than one name is presented to the conference, a written ballot vote shall be taken. The person receiving a majority of votes cast shall be declared elected. If no one candidate receives a majority, the voting shall be repeated after dropping the candidate receiving the fewest votes each time until one person receives a majority vote. If or when there are only two candidates, the presiding officer shall cast a ballot at the same time as all other ballots are cast but that ballot shall be counted only in the event of a tie.
- 10. The regional conference shall, in the consideration of all names presented, be guided by the principles, traditions and precedents of Kiwanis International in its election of officers, and particularly consider the ability, service and Kiwanis experience of a proposed candidate.
- 11. The latest edition of Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority for all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the constitution and bylaws of Kiwanis International, the bylaws of the Pennsylvania District and these standing rules.

XV. Youth Protection and Criminal Background Checks

Section 1: POLICY

To ensure the highest standard of leadership and to ensure that adults working with youth are of the utmost moral fiber, the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International requires clear criminal history background checks and clearances for all District Board Members, Regional Trustees, Lieutenant Governors, and District Chairs (District Officials) as part of the eligibility criteria to hold such positions. In addition, the Pennsylvania District requires clear criminal history background checks and clearances for all Kiwanians and for non-members (such as District Chairs and administrators and their assistants or committee members) working on behalf of the District with youth under age 18 and for all adults – both Kiwanians and non-

members – registered for, participating in, or staying overnight at any event organized by the District involving youth under age 18.

A criminal history background check is considered "not clear" if it indicates a felony or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude; a felony or conviction or registration of a violent and/or sexual nature; a felony or conviction or registration involving any type of abuse of a child, involving threatening or intimidating behavior, or otherwise of a physical nature; or a felony related to larceny or theft. (Reference Commonwealth of Pennsylvania House Bill 435/Act 153 of 2014) Other types of felony convictions will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the District Youth Protection Manager. Any conviction legally reversed or overturned by the proper authorities shall not be considered when evaluating background checks and clearances.

Successful completion of background checks and clearances (a "clear check") is based on verification that none of the above and none of the convictions prohibited in any Pennsylvania District or Kiwanis International policies or similar thereto have been determined for that person. A clear check is necessary to be an eligible candidate for Pennsylvania District Board membership; thus, candidates must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager before elections are held. District appointees must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager before assuming the appointed position. Adults working with youth as stated above must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager prior to arrival at the District event.

The Pennsylvania District recognizes only the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's criminal history background check/clearance process as valid. All background checks shall be reviewed and evaluated by the District Youth Protection Manager and determined to be clear or not clear, based on the criteria stated above. The District Executive Director shall be advised if a check indicates a problem or concern that requires further investigation or is determined to be not clear. In either case, the District Youth Protection Manager shall notify the individual in question. A check that is not clear causes automatic denial of the right to hold the position or attend the event in question.

The District Board shall have final authority on the matter.

Background checks are valid for a period of 36 months. All relevant persons as noted previously who have not had the necessary criminal history background checks and clearances and have not been verified as clear within the last 36 months at any given time are required to submit current criminal history background checks and clearances documentation.

Each individual subject to a background check/clearance shall be responsible for obtaining the background check/clearance, submitting the results to the District Youth Safety Manager, and paying the related fees. Checks and clearances shall be conducted as inexpensively as reasonably possible to ensure accurate results.

Members of the community who attend Kiwanis Pennsylvania District events as guests and who are not responsible for the welfare of a child other than their own, or do not have direct routine interaction with children other than their own, are not subject to this policy. However, the Pennsylvania District reserves the right to refuse any individual the right to participate in a District-sponsored activity if the person is known to possess a criminal history as defined in this policy.

SECTION 2: PROCEDURE

- All background check and clearance documentation must be submitted to the District Youth Safety Manager. The District will accept copies of background check and clearance documentation that a member has obtained for the purpose of employment or participation as a volunteer in other organizations as long as the check was done according to Commonwealth House Bill 435/ Act 153 of 2014.
- © Current District Officials as of April 18, 2015 must submit Pennsylvania background check and clearance documentation to the District Youth Safety Manager no later than July 1, 2015. Candidates for District Board membership must submit the necessary background check and clearance documentation before elections are held. Adults working with youth as stated above must receive a clear check from the District Youth Safety Manager prior to arrival at the District event.
 - o To register for a Pennsylvania Criminal History Background Check, go to www.psp.pa.gov/Pages/Request-a-Criminal-History-Record.aspx#.VSVXBhDwEdo for a direct link to the online registration form).
 - O To register for a Pennsylvania Child Abuse Clearance, go to https://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis/public/home
 - o To register for an FBI Criminal History Background Check, go to https://www.pa.cogentid.com/index.htm.
- Once background check/clearance documentation has been submitted to the District Youth Safety Manager, he/she will notify the District Executive Director and the individual if the check is considered clear or not clear, and if deemed not clear, will provide an explanation for that determination.
- The District Youth Safety Manager will provide all background check/clearance documentation to the District Executive Director for District records after it has been evaluated. The District Executive Director will maintain these records for a period of twelve (12) years.
- The District Executive Director will track compliance with this policy and will notify the appropriate individuals when their clearance is due for renewal.
- The District Youth Safety Manager will keep the District Executive Director informed of the status of compliance with the Criminal History Background Checks policy on an ongoing basis.
- Obscipline: Individuals with a background check determined to be not clear will be subject to the following actions:
 - A. Current District Board Members or District appointees will be disciplined as determined by the District Board, including but not limited to suspension or removal from their position.
 - B. Candidates for any District Board position or District appointment will be considered disqualified as a candidate for such office.
 - C. Adults wishing to participate in District youth events will not be allowed to do so.
 - D. Conduct unbecoming process may be engaged depending on convictions identified in the report.

XVI. Keystone Kiwanian

In order to assure accuracy of information in the Keystone Kiwanian, the KK editor is required to send the draft copy of the next issue to the Marketing and Public Relations Chairperson for proofreading. The Marketing and PR chairperson will forward the copy to the District Trustees for review of photographs and names associated with them for accuracy. A tight turnaround time will be set for this process and no extensions will be granted. Upon correction of mistakes, the KK will be published.

The District shall produce at least two (2) issues of the District Bulletin (the Keystone Kiwanian) in each administrative year.

XVII. District Convention

No sitting board member may nominate or second a candidate for district office at the District Convention.

The Theme Basket operation at the District Convention is under control of the District Foundation. The Foundation will provide a report annually on this activity to the District Board.

Any Kiwanis Club in good standing in the District and with Kiwanis International may submit an invitation to hold a district convention in a city or area of their choice. Commercial convention facilities also may submit proposals for consideration. All such invitations and/or proposals should be submitted in writing to the District Executive Director.

The official program of a convention as approved by the Board of Trustees shall be the order of the day for all sessions. Changes in the program may be made from time to time by a majority vote of the delegates and delegates-at-large present and voting.

All resolutions submitted sixty (60) days prior to the date of the district convention shall be referred to the Committee on Resolutions for its consideration and recommendation to the convention. No resolutions other than those submitted or originated by the Committee on Resolutions shall be considered unless consideration thereof shall be recommended by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Trustees. Debate on such resolutions shall not be in order until they have been reported out by the Committee on Resolutions.

Reports of committees, communications to the convention, resolutions presented by the Committee on Resolutions, and all motions save such as are "undebatable" may be debated upon the floor of the convention, unless by a two-thirds (2/3) vote the convention decides to dispose of them without debate.

XVIII. PA Kiwanis Foundation

The following Fundraising and Solicitation Policy for the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation was adopted:

- 1. Authorization to conduct fundraising campaigns:
 - a. The Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation (Foundation) encourages fundraising efforts by Kiwanis Clubs and members on behalf of the Foundation as formally authorized by the Foundation's board of directors.

- b. Fundraising of any type by other persons and organizations will be reviewed on a case by case basis. This type of fundraising will be done for Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation purposes only.
- c. No person or club may use the Foundation's taxpayer ID number in connection with solicitation of funds or issue a formal acknowledgement receipt except the District Executive Director or other person expressly authorized by the Foundation president.

2. General guidelines

- a. Fundraising efforts may include an annual campaign for unrestricted funds, appeals for gifts restricted for approved existing Foundation programs and an endowment campaign which may be authorized by the Board of Directors.
- b. All funds raised or donated in accordance with the policy will be used at the discretion of the Foundation Board of Directors in accordance with the Foundation's gift acceptance policy.
- 3. Guidelines for fundraising by outside persons and organizations
 - a. Outside persons and organizations wishing to raise funds for Foundation purposes may act in the name of the Foundation only after the Foundation's Board of Directors have reviewed and approved the fundraising plan. The Board will determine the following:
 - i. Specific purpose and scope of the project
 - ii. Starting and end dates of the campaign
 - iii. Financial procedures to be followed
 - iv. Advertising and publicity to be utilized
 - v. Evidence that the Foundation and its personnel and agents will be fully indemnified against loss or damage.
 - vi. All funds raised for the Foundation by outside parties must be promptly remitted to the Foundation District Office with information documenting the source and amount of funds donated as well as any restrictions placed on the gifts by donors.
 - b. The preceding guidelines are in no way intended to limit or preclude outside persons or organizations from donating funds to the Foundation or soliciting funds for the Foundation at the request of the Foundation Board of Directors or its designated agent, so long as the provisions of this policy are satisfied.

XIX. District Website Operations

The following rates will be in place for advertising on the Pennsylvania District website:

 - c. 6 month agreement \$850 for six months
 - d. 3 month agreement \$500 for three months
 - e. 2 month agreement \$400 for two months
 - f. 1 month agreement \$300 for one month
- 2. Business and non-Kiwanis organizational rate for subpages only
 - a. 2 year agreement \$625 per year
 - b. 1 year agreement \$750 per year
 - c. 6 month agreement \$425 for six months
 - d. 3 month agreement \$250 for three months
 - e. 2 month agreement \$200 for two months

- f. 1 month agreement \$150 for one month
- 3. Kiwanis Club and Kiwanis Related organizational rate for home page and subpages
 - a. 2 year agreement \$625 per year
 - b. 1 year agreement \$750 per year
 - c. 6 month agreement \$425 for six months
 - d. 3 month agreement \$250 for three months
 - e. 2 month agreement \$200 for two months
 - f. 1 month agreement \$150 for one month
- 4. Kiwanis Club and Kiwanis Related organizational rate for subpages only
 - a. 2 year agreement \$300 per year
 - b. 1 year agreement \$375 per year
 - c. 6 month agreement \$200 for six months
 - d. 3 month agreement \$125 for three months
 - e. 2 month agreement \$100 for two months
 - f. 1 month agreement \$75 for one month

XX. Membership Initiatives

- A Kiwanis SLP Community or District-based alumni chapter has been added to the current campaign
 for growth in accordance with the spirit of the 2007 flexibility amendment to the Kiwanis
 International Bylaws and in concert with the activities of the Bridge the Gap committee.
- 2. District Network Kiwanis Clubs: Each District Network Kiwanis Club shall be organized, affiliated, and monitored by their established Kiwanis International district. Membership will be open to all former Kiwanis members who, for whatever reason, are in between club memberships but left the club in good standing. District and Kiwanis International dues and fees will be the same as for other Kiwanis clubs in their respective Districts.

XXI. Policy on Unclaimed Property

The District shall monitor and claim any unclaimed property residing with the Office of the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and shall also claim the property of any club no longer in existence and shall alert all current clubs of property to be claimed. The District Foundation shall pursue the property of any club Foundation no longer in existence.

XXII. Policy on Public Activities

- 1. The District may, from time to time, express by proper means its attitude on questions of public importance and any proposed legislation affecting communities within the territory of the district, provided that no Kiwanis clubs outside of the district are affected by the same.
- 2. When Kiwanis clubs outside of the district are affected by any such public questions or such proposed legislation, the district shall refer the matter, with its recommendation to the International Board of Trustees. Upon approval of the recommendation by the International Board, the District may publicly express its opinion through legal and proper means.

- 3. The District shall not be used in any way for political purposes, nor shall it as a District actively participate in the political candidacy of any person.
- 4. Notwithstanding Sections 1, 2 and 3 above, no substantial part of the activities of the District shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the District shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

XXIII. Committees of the Pennsylvania District

The standing committees of the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis International shall be:

- a. Circle K Clubs
- b. Key Clubs
- c. Kiwanis Kids programs
- d. Key Leader
- e. Audit
- f. Laws, Regulations and Resolutions
- g. Builders Clubs
- h. Aktion Clubs
- i. Past District Governors
- j. District Foundation Nominating

Section 2. The above listed standing committees shall have the following duties:

- a. The Committee of Past District Governors shall be composed of Past District Governors of this district who are still members of clubs within the district. The chairman of the Committee of Past District Governors shall be the most recent Past District Governor preceding the Immediate Past District Governor.
- b. The District Audit Committee shall consist of Kiwanians who are not members of the Board of Trustees and do not occupy any position of authority over any of the funds of the District. They must also be qualified in accounting and willing to devote the time necessary to perform the duties of the committee.
- c. The District Foundation Nominating Committee shall consist of at least one member from the District Board of Trustees, one member of the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation Board of Directors and at least three (3) additional members.

XXIV. Contracts

- No person, except the District Governor or District Executive Director, after authorization by the
 District Board of Trustees, may enter into and sign a contract, pledge or commitment which contains
 a potential financial obligation to the District or any of its Administrative Divisions individually or
 collectively.
- 2. No person, except an officer or member of a member club, after authorization by that member club's Board of Directors, may enter into and sign a contract, pledge or commitment which contains a potential financial obligation to that club.
- 3. Any person who enters into and signs a contract, pledge or commitment which contains a potential financial obligation to the District, any of its Administrative Divisions or any of its member clubs

- contrary to the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Article shall be held personally responsible and liable for such contract, pledge or commitment.
- 4. Only by formal written motion may the District Board of Trustees authorize a contract, pledge or commitment to be entered into and signed on behalf of the District or any of its Administrative Divisions by other than the District Governor or District Secretary/Treasurer.
- 5. Contracts executed for services such as meals, entertainment and so forth provided in direct connection with official visits of the District Governor involving one or more Divisions may be executed without prior approval of the District Board of Trustees.

RE: Questions of KC Graduate Program

Dear Stef Patounas,

Thank you for the questions regarding the Rocky Mountain District (RMD) KC Graduate Program. I have received your questions from our Governor Elect Jon Mangino and will attempt to respond to you in this letter format, rather than a long email.

• Did you district ever consider giving the alumni regular membership status instead of honorary status? What do you think of such a variation? This is something we are evaluating for our implementation.

The Alumni Program was not a consideration in the development of our KC Graduate Program. We wanted to create something that was more proactive to engage the KC Graduate directly with Kiwanis or Circle K members. Giving them full member status only means someone will be paying dues. The KC Graduate program is not intended to create a cash flow for anyone, just the continuation of communication and interaction with the Kiwanis family for the KC Graduate. The Alumni program is a passive program with little connection to Kiwanis Clubs.

 Have you had any Kiwanis clubs push back on the additional administrative work? Do you have any clubs that have been really successful in managing the program? How do they handle it? Some of our clubs sponsor as many as five Key Clubs. I would imagine they could see a significant increase in members.

The KC Graduate is a District level program, not a Club level program. The major reason is to protect the sensitive contact information of the KC Graduate. This is suggested in the Kiwanis Youth Protection Guidelines. The fact that the members are usually over the age of 18 has no bearing in this. They are away from home and their parents are still very concerned about the safety of their children. The program is better controlled with one contact person for the KC Graduate to deal with. The Home Club is notified and can provide what they wish in support of the KC Graduate that may have been a member of the Key Club or Circle K Club they sponsored. That is a process of adopting the Policy statement in support of the KC Graduate program.

 How were the requirements established? Have they been well-received? Most of our clubs don't have documented service requirements for regular members. In some instances, this would require more from our SLP alumni than the other members of the same Kiwanis Club.

The requirements were established by discussions with select members of the Key Clubs, Circle K Clubs, and the RMD Kiwanis District Staff. Then a one year, Pilot program was completed, then input from all parties on what worked and what didn't was considered. We revised the program based on these ideas as a result of the Pilot program and released the program, as it is

today, the following year. It took approximately three years to build this program and many people in our RMD were involved. The requirements are intended to provide some impetus for the KC Graduate to participate in the Kiwanis Family which shows their commitment to the program and to Kiwanis. Without this you have what the Alumni program provides. We are looking to encourage those who exhibit the highest degree of commitment to stay with Kiwanis. They will become our best leaders.

The program has been very well received by KC Graduates, Kiwanis Clubs, and Circle K members all over the country. I have talked to 50 to 60 of these people and have never had a discouraging remark. I have never had s Kiwanis Club President turn down the opportunity to have a young member attend and be active with their club.

Did you have any challenges with the implementation of the program?

The largest challenge is marketing. How to get the information out to the regular District members was our biggest hurdle. Going into our third year, that remains difficult. We use forums at Kiwanis Conferences, Key Club and Circle K Conventions, training at Lt. Governor Orientation, and simply going the Key Club meetings all over the District. It takes a lot of time for the KC Graduate Administrator, but if they believe in the program, they will find the time. This will not be an overnight success. Good things never are and good things are usually not easy.

My first disappointment was after the first year not many KC Graduates renewed their membership. The second year was the same. I've had time to think about that now and realize that may be normal. Once the KC Graduate is settled in to their new environment and feel comfortable, they do not feel the need for the program. That is a good thing. That means we have helped someone obtain comfort in a strange and sometimes scary place. They have come to realize that Kiwanis people are concerned for their welfare and will help with almost any situation the KC Graduate gets into.

Have you started to see any of the honorary membership be converted into regular members? Is there another way
your district is measuring the success of the program? I know the program is young, but any information about it's
general success and/or anecdotal stories would be great!

Yes, we have seen growth in both Kiwanis and Circle K. Not so much in our District, but others around the globe. Currently I have a KC Graduate attending TCU in Fort Worth, Texas. TCU is a very large college in a very large metropolitan community. They do not have a Circle K Club. She is working to get one established on campus as we speak. I have a KC Graduate in Atchison, Kansas attending Benedictine College. She is sophomore there and regularly attends the Kiwanis Club meeting there. They really appreciate her and her energy in their club. She is a regular member of their Kiwanis Club. I have another KC Graduate that went into the army several years ago. She has had two tours in Afghanistan and is currently assigned at Fort Levenworth. She received email newsletters from her Home Kiwanis Club while in Afghanistan. A little touch of home was extremely important to her! A current KC Graduate attends NYU in downtown New York City. He was very motivated to attend NYU for his college studies. However he was a little apprehensive about the City environment. He came from a fairly rural environment and dropping into New York City was not comfortable for him. I got him in touch with the Circle K President during the summer before he arrived and they made him feel very comfortable before

he ever got there. He now is the Publicity Director for the Circle K Club ant NYU in his freshman year. I have many stories to bore you with, but needless to say, the KC Graduate program is working. We still continue to refine and adjust things but basically it is a remarkable program. Even in it's small effect it is successful if we get just one new Kiwanis member. We get about 25 to 30 members a year and, so far, after two years, we have two new Circle K Clubs, about 27 new Circle K members, approximately 8 new Kiwanis members in various Kiwanis Club all over the country.

The program is not an easy one to administer, but is very rewarding. We are still learning. We believe it is a valuable program and one in which several of us here in the Rocky Mountain District have discussed for many years. We have learned that it is very important for the Key Club Advisors and Circle K Advisors to market the program to those they advise. They have to explain the program can help the new KC Graduate feel more comfortable in a strange environment with the Kiwanis connection. Kiwanis members are here to help them. Even if it is a simple referral to a dentist when the student gets a tooth ache, miles from home, and does not know where to turn for relief, the KC Graduate quickly learns that Kiwanis people are good to know.
