

DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

October 3, 2015

The first meeting of the 2015-16 District Board of Trustees was held on October 3, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Jennifer Vare presided. The meeting was called to order at 9:30AM.

The inspirational thought/invocation was provided by Trustee Judy Janes.

All board members were present.

Guests included Circle K District Administrator Kelly Shaup, Lt. Governor Bill McCabe, Past Lt. Governor Tracy Smith and Administration Chair Paul Kasoff.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages p2-p12)

Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski called into the meeting.

Clubs organized in the 2013-14 and 2014-15 year were verbally reviewed as no written reports were received.

Initial clubs to be organized in 2015-16 were discussed. Region 1 is looking Smethport and Cochran. Region 2 has no specific targets but some focus may go to Connellsville and Fox Chapel. Region 5 has a plan in place for Columbia; the East Shore area and Hamburg were discussed. The Old Forge area was discussed in Region VI. Hughesville in Region IV was discussed as well as South Williamsport and Loyalsock. Region VII is Northwest Philadelphia and Central Bucks.

Clubs that were in need of special counselling include Greencastle, Lehigh Valley Industrial Park, West Shore, Hatboro-Horsham, Kennett Square, Nittany, Kittanning and King of Prussia.

The Kiwanis and JCI partnership was discussed. Executive Director Kevin Thomas will work on information to share with Kiwanis clubs and JCI clubs.

Consent Agenda (See the pages p13-p68)

All items in the consent agenda were approved by proper motion, second and vote. (Note: The Club Leadership Education agenda was removed from the consent agenda for discussion later.)

Discussion and Action items

Club Leadership Education was discussed after being removed from the consent agenda. Governor Jen Vare will follow up with Education Chair Dennis Bouchard about the numbers, attendance and possible follow up to get more officers to take the online training.

Vacancies in 2015-16 Lt. Governor positions were discussed; divisions 4 and 8 are vacant. At the present time, there are no candidates for those divisions. Discussions will be held about the Division 5 and 6 Lt. Governors doing some communication outreach to those divisions.

The vacancy in the Region III trustee was discussed. A motion was introduced, seconded and approved to appoint Ann Graves from the Kiwanis Club of State College as Region III Trustee subject to her agreeing in a conversation with Governor Jen Vare.

A review of the candidates for 2016-17 Trustee positions took place. See page 69. Rules and procedures on the Election of Trustees were discussed and will be updated for upcoming elections in accordance with district bylaws.

2016-17 Lt. Governors were reviewed. See page 72.

Discussion was held on potential redivisioning. Trustees are to talk to Lt. Governors and other past leaders in their regions about any potential need for redivisioning and this will be discussed at the next meeting.

Potential changes to Lt. Governor reports were reviewed based on a potential report form submitted by Lt. Governor Sarah Zulueta; input was offered by board members that will be relayed to Sarah by Jen Vare. A final version of the report will be considered on a conference call on November 10, 2015.

The 2015 District Convention was reviewed. See pages 77-78. There was a general consensus to not have formal entertainment on Saturday at the Governor's banquet.

November 10th was established as a date for a conference call to approve the Midwinter Budget and program.

The possibility of doing a shoe drive at Midwinter was discussed. See pages 79-80 for information. A motion was approved, with one abstention, to authorize further investigation of this project and report to board on the feasibility of doing this on a November 10th conference call.

Proposals for the 2017 and 2018 District Conventions were discussed. A motion was introduced, seconded and approved to have the 2017 District Convention at the Doubletree Lancaster and the 2018 District Convention at the Doubletree Pittsburgh Greentree.

The possibility of a joint convention with the New Jersey District was held. There have been informal discussions about this possibility. It was decided to do nothing with this until if or when a formal request is received from the New Jersey District Board of Trustees.

Board members completed and signed conflict of interest statements.

The District Investments and Account Balances reports were reviewed; see pages 95-100.

A proposed District budget was considered for the 2015-16 year; see page 101 for the proposed budget.

A motion was introduced, seconded and approved to adopt the proposed budget. Another motion was then introduced to allow the Trustees and the Immediate Past Governor to receive a stipend of up to \$100 per board meeting to defray the travel and attendance expense of board meetings. The motion was seconded and approved.

Based on the approval of the previous motion, another motion was introduced to amend the adopted 2015-16 District operating budget to move \$3,200 from the miscellaneous line item to a line earmarked for Trustee/Immediate Past Governor Board Meeting. The motion was seconded and approved. The amended budget is page 101A.

The District Holiday Party was approved for December 18, 2015.

The District Raffle was approved for the 2015-16 year with no changes to its operation.

A report was provided on District shirts. See page 105-106.

It was reported that the District Electric Choice program is not taking traction and rates are increasing. Executive Director Kevin Thomas reported that because of the increases folks are not renewing. The Electric Choice program appears not to be a viable fundraiser for the District and active promotion will be discontinued.

With the pending retirement of Robin Cook, the board considered a proposal regarding the position of District administrative secretary. It is page 107. The proposal was approved by the District Board.

The contract for District Executive Director Kevin Thomas expires on September 30, 2016. A committee consisting of Governor Jen Vare, Governor-elect John Gräb, Immediate Past Governor Bob Raub and Trustee Keith Smith will enter into negotiations with Kevin Thomas regarding a new agreement to present to the board at the January board meeting.

The 2016 Key Club District Convention budget was brought up for approval. It is page 108. The budget was approved

An update was provided on strategic planning. Kiwanis International will be having a meeting on December 11-12 in Newark, New Jersey to help Districts develop their own plan based on the Kiwanis International strategic plan and Pennsylvania will be invited to that meeting.

An update was provided on our work with Early Childhood Development.

An effort is underway to establish a date for an SLP Administrators conference.

Board members were encouraged to provide support in getting clubs to submit their new form of standard club bylaws.

Background checks of District Board members, Lt. Governors and District Chairs were reviewed. Follow up will be conducted with those not having submitted their clearances. A motion was introduced, seconded and approved to amend the District policy on background checks to have them come to the District office for review by the District Executive Director. If a check is not clear, it will then be sent by Executive Director to the District Youth Protection chair for further review and possible action.

A discussion was held between the board and Circle K Administrator Kelly Shaup on a potential policy for the Circle K District board members as it relates to the need for volunteer background checks and Pennsylvania state law. After the discussion, Administrator Shaup felt he had enough direction to work with the Circle K board and Kiwanis committee to develop a policy for them to consider and adopt.

The Pennsylvania District 2015-16 Distinguished Club award was presented for approval. See page 124. The award was approved by the board.

Trustee Kate Feryo will provide a report on recommendations for District awards at our next meeting.

A discussion took place on an Emergency Communication policy. A committee will be appointed to develop a proposed plan. The committee will consist of Jen Vare, John Grab, Mike Coolbaugh, Kevin Thomas plus the Administrators/Chairs of the Circle K, Key Club, Aktion club and Key Leader administrators or someone from their committees as determined by the administrators of those committees.

A proposal was considered for partnering with EDC Educational Services; see pages 119-123. Governor Jen Vare and Kevin Thomas will schedule a meeting with Denita Richardson to explore the proposal further.

Partnering with Barnes and Noble on a District wide bookfair program was discussed. After discussion, approval for the program was given pending review of materials and program implementation requirements at the November 10, 2015 board conference call.

Board members were reminded of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Kiwanis license plate program.

A discussion was held on the format and nature of future board meeting agendas.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

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The DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

July 18, 2015

The fourth meeting of the 2014-15 District Board of Trustees was held on April 18, 2015 at the Kiwanis District Office, Harrisburg, PA. Governor Bob Raub presided. The meeting was called to order at 9:30AM.

The invocation was provided by Lt. Governor John Grab.

All board members were present except Trustees Kate Feryo, Ann Graves and Keith Smith.

Guests included Circle K District Administrator Kelly Shaup, Past Governor and Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski & David, Key Leader District Chair Stef Stamatopoulos, Builders Club Administrator Tiffany Callaio and District Foundation President Ben Osterhout.

Membership & New Club Building (See the pages p1-p14)

Current membership statistics were reviewed.

Formula Chair Cathy Szymanski provided a report. Clubs by region and division were reviewed with extensive discussion.

The Lehigh Valley Industrial Park club was discussed. A plan of action was discussed and reviewed.

The Ebensburg Club was reviewed and a course of action reviewed.

Consent Agenda (See the pages p15-p79)

All items in the consent agenda were approved with the exception of the Minutes from the April 18, 2015 Board Meeting and the Executive Director's Report.

Discussion and Action items

The minutes of the April 18, 2015 were considered for amendment. Governor-elect Jen Vare shared that her notes indicate a motion was left out of those minutes. A discussion took place on the best manner to handle it. After that discussion, a motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the minutes as accepted without amendment as it was decided to handle the missed motion later in the agenda. (Note: In the course of later discussion, this item was overlooked. Accordingly, board members were surveyed via email and asked if the correction/motion could be reflected in these minutes. No objection was raised. Accordingly, a letter will be written and sent at the earliest opportunity to clubs in the District about the need to have a club policy on youth protection and member criminal history & background checks.)

The Executive Director's report was considered and can be seen as page 5/29. The Executive Director's report was approved.

The Circle K District budget for 2015-16 was reviewed and then approved by the Kiwanis District Board. It is page p81-p82. Circle K District Administrator Kelly Shaup provided updates and reported that the Circle K District Governor Taylor Spencer has resigned for health reasons. A process is in place to find a replacement.

A review of the District budget, investments and account balances took place. See the pages p83 -p89.

The Super Raffle was reviewed. A report can be seen as page p90.

An update was provided on District shirts. It is page p91.

Clubs not submitting a 2015-16 Election report were reviewed.

2015-16 Lt. Governor and Trustee vacancies were discussed. There are some possibilities being considered and discussed for the vacancies in Division 4 and 8. The region III trustee position was discussed.

The 2015 District Convention was reviewed. Attendance, ad sales, program changes and forums were discussed. A motion was introduced and approved to grant the Pennsylvania Kiwanis Foundation permission to sell Kiwanis logo lanyards to benefit the early learning fund of the foundation. A discussion took place on the best manner to utilize Kiwanis International President John Button's attendance at our convention.

The 2017 District Convention was discussed. Proposals from the Radisson Harrisburg, Doubletree Lancaster, Wyndham Grand Pittsburgh and Doubletree Greentree Pittsburgh were reviewed. After review, it was decided by motion, second and vote to narrow the consideration to the Doubletree Lancaster and Doubletree Greentree Pittsburgh. A site inspection will be scheduled for the Doubletree Lancaster; one may not be scheduled for the Doubletree Greentree Pittsburgh. A final decision will be made at the October 3, 2015 board meeting.

A proposal from the Penn Stater Hotel and Conference Center to host the 2017 Midwinter Conference was reviewed. After review, a motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the proposal with the caveat the Executive Director is free to negotiate lower rates if possible.

Club Officer Education was discussed. Certified trainers were discussed as well as the need to schedule dates. Dates that have been scheduled were reviewed.

2015-16 Fall regional meetings and Governor's Visits were discussed and additional dates established. The updated calendar is seen as pages p114-p115.

The report of the Foundation nominating was reviewed. It can be seen as page p116.

Strategic planning was reviewed. It was indicated that Kiwanis International will be organizing events to help Districts develop their own strategic plan based on the Kiwanis International plan. No dates for this have yet been established.

Discussion took place on the bylaws as it relates to Lt. Governor qualifications and elections. No action was taken but concern was expressed that we need to be aware that we cannot ignore the bylaws.

The adoption at convention of the new District Bylaws was discussed. After discussion, it was agreed that we move to adopt the new bylaws in their entirety and as a single document. It was agreed that Executive Director Kevin Thomas will speak to the adoption of the new bylaws during his report to the convention. All board members will, also, be prepared to speak in favor of the new bylaws. As part of the discussion on how to adopt the new bylaws, the Standing Rules for the House of Delegates at the convention were amended to limit the time for discussion of amendments and bylaws to 15 total minutes and the time that had to expire before the question could be called was shortened to 10 minutes.

Key Leader District Chair Stef Stamotopolous presented a proposal for Key Leader in Pennsylvania in 2015-16. The proposal is pages 15/29 & 16/29. A motion was made, seconded and approved to have a Key Leader event at Camp Conrad Weiser on April 22-24, 2016 with the required financial guarantees to Kiwanis International. A motion was made, seconded and approved to have a Key Leader event at Camp Allegheny on May 13-15, 2016 with the required financial guarantees to Kiwanis International.

Applications for the position of Keystone Kiwanian Editor were reviewed. Brett Cutright of the Kiwanis Club of PA eKiwanis and Morgan Harding of the Kiwanis Club of Wyoming Area submitted applications for the position. After consideration, the District Board voted to select Brett Cutright as Editor, effective immediately.

The District Policy on criminal and child abuse background checks was discussed in light of recent changes made in Pennsylvania law for volunteers dealing with children. After discussion, a motion was approved to change the requirement that background checks be done every 3 years to a requirement they be done every 5 years.

Crisis planning and crisis communication were discussed. The District presently has no policy in this regard. After discussion, it was decided that a committee be appointed to develop a crisis management plan and a crisis communication plan for the District and that an initial report of the committee be provided at the October 3, 2015 board meeting.

Per the request/direction of Kiwanis International, the District board adopted a policy on Personal Confidential Information. See the page p148 for the new policy.

The District Board discussed the possibility of a district merger.

A discussion was held on submitting a resolution to the house of delegates at the upcoming district convention which would resolve that Pennsylvania will commit to raising \$1.4 million for the Eliminate Campaign by 2020. After consideration, a motion was moved, seconded but was not approved to prepare such a resolution for consideration at the convention. (Note: This was a vote 4 in favor, none against and 4 abstaining. Since there were 8 voting board members present, this motion would have required 5 votes in favor to be approved.)

The official District logo, which isn't in compliance with current Kiwanis International graphic standards, was examined by the board. By motion, second and vote, it was agreed to replace the "globe" Serving the Children of the World emblem within the current District logo with the Kiwanis International seal emblem.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Every region needs to open at least one new club this year and club satellites do not count as a full-fledged new Kiwanis Club, only as new members to an existing club.

At today's board meeting, Jen is going to ask each of you to commit to where you will be opening your first club of the year, when do you plan on starting and when do you plan on completing this club.

A club satellite does not count! The club needs to be completed before April 1, 2016. April and May our concentration will be Region seven.

We will know in October if the Kiwanis International Board is choosing Pennsylvania as the Club Opening Event.

We have four club openers from Pennsylvania going to Seattle October 18-21st. We are all excited about this great learning opportunity. I have been asked to be a lead club opener, with one other person and have started working on Seattle already. This gives Pennsylvania a great advantage by making us aware of what will need to be done in advance.

I am asking that each of you go back to your LTG's and have them get membership chairs from all clubs in their divisions.

Even if it is a small club, they need to have a membership chair. All members are obviously part of the membership committee, however; we need that one single person singled out and emailed over to. This past year we made great strides in getting names, this year we need to have all clubs input their membership chairs names.

I am asking that you think outside the box when thinking about membership. Stay on top of your LTG's and clubs about membership. Even though you think your ideas are great and this has worked for your club does not necessary mean it will work for another club. Sometimes hearing from someone else makes all the difference in the world.

I am always available and willing to come to meetings to talk about growth in existing clubs. My eye candy (David) is willing and able to drive me where ever I need to be as long as we have enough notice. So please don't wait until the last minute to contact us about an issue going on in a club. the sooner we know about it, the sooner we can get someone in there to help out.

We had several clubs this past August and September that took us by surprise when a LTG notified us of issues. We need to make sure we are truly aware of what is going on with all clubs in your region. This involves communication which you will be hearing a lot from Governor Jen about. The more you are communicating with your LTG's and clubs the more you are aware of what is going on in clubs.

We have to focus on strengthening existing clubs and opening new clubs. We cannot focus on the politics of clubs or who likes who and what club is doing this and that. The goal is to make our community's safer and stronger because of Kiwanis.

Member retention is very important for clubs as well as let's face it the district budget. The more members we can have staying in Kiwanis the more service that community gets and our district can focus on doing more with more money.

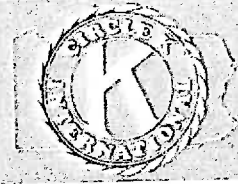

Report to District Council

From: Phil Weber, District Youth Protection Manager

This report covers the current status of Youth Protection in the District, and my goals over the next year.

Current Status

1. In early August, Kiwanis International issued a memo to all District Youth Protection Managers in North America. Included was a spreadsheet showing the status of every club in each District in the US and Canada that sponsors one or more SLPs, as to whether the designated Kiwanis Advisor to each SLP club is on record as having secured background checks. Club Secretaries are responsible for reporting this information.

Of the 89 Kiwanis Clubs in the PA District that sponsor SLPs, only 39 were shown by International to be “fully compliant”, that is, all Advisors have their background checks completed. I know this is wrong, using my home club as an example of a club showing Advisors without checks that I personally know have them. One of my actions over the next 12 months will be to stress the need for Club Secretaries to accurately report the statuses of all SLP Advisors in their clubs, with the goal of 100% of PA District Clubs in compliance. I will work through the Lt. Governors in those Divisions that have one, and directly with the clubs in those Divisions that do not.

2. I presented a session on Youth Protection at the 2015 Annual Convention in Erie. Mike Coolbaugh and Matt Wise assisted. The session was less well attended (approx. 30 attendees) than a year ago (Standing Room Only), but also less contentious. I will offer sessions at the 2016 Mid-Winter Conference and 2016 Annual Convention.
3. In late August, Kevin Thomas issued a list of all District-level elected and appointed Kiwanians, including the PA Kiwanis Foundation board, with the status of their background checks, per District Policy. According to District records, as of September 13th, a number of individuals under the District Youth Protection Policy have not submitted copies of their PSP and/or ChildLine clearances. Again, this is hoped to be an oversight by the individuals. It will be one of my goals to use whatever persuasion I can to ensure that every Kiwanian requiring checks per District Policy is in compliance, with copies of their background checks on file at the District Office. I will report to the District Leadership Council at their next meeting any Kiwanian who, by that time, would be in violation of District or Foundation Policy.

4. Youth Protection Week. Kiwanis International declared the week of September 13 – 19 'Youth Protection Week'. The purpose of this week is to stress the need for all Kiwanians and Kiwanis Clubs to be aware of Youth Protection guidelines, and provide training at the individual and club levels. Kiwanis Guidelines require every Club to provide a session on Youth Protection Guidelines annually, as part of a regular meeting. There is a check box on the Club Secretary report to indicate compliance. An article on Youth Protection is scheduled to appear in the next issue of the Keystone Kiwanian.

5. Goals: I have set the following Youth Protection goals for the 2015 – 16 Administrative year under Governor Jen:
 - a. Through Keystone Kiwanian articles, training and other communications, seek to get 100% of:
 - i. District Clubs reporting Club training
 - ii. Correct reporting of SLP Advisor background checks
 - iii. District officers, chairs and Foundation members in compliance.
 - b. Prepare articles or brief submissions for each issue of the Keystone Kiwanian.
 - c. Prepare reports for each meeting of the District Board
 - d. Present training sessions at the 2016 Mid-Winter Conference, and 2016 Annual Convention.


Laws and Regulations Committee Report to District Board of Trustees October 3, 2015

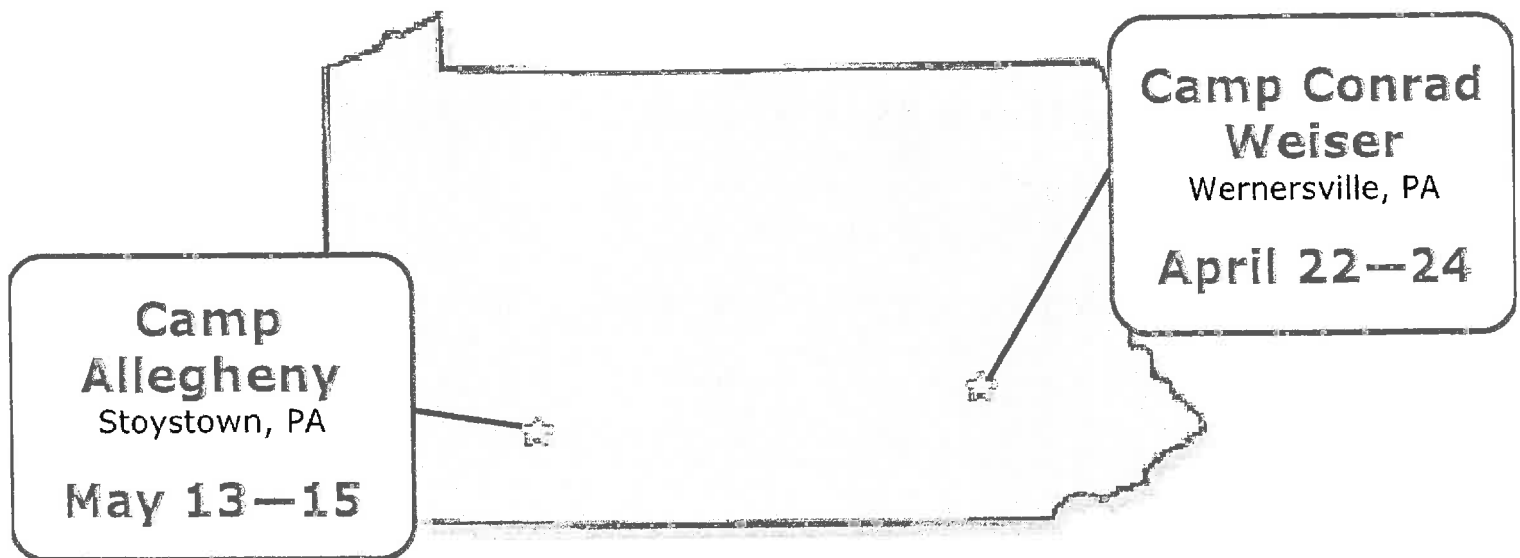

We will be working within four areas over the next year.

Promoting Individual Growth and Leadership and Setting the Foundation

Idea:

We are looking to reset the District Calendar into a more student friendly format.

Later in the year, we will be looking at resetting the expectations for officer transitions for a better district officer transition over for next year.

Current Progress:

The calendar is still a work in progress with dates set until December. Spring Officer Training and Spring Flings (Divisional Rallies) to be determined. InterPACK was later then first targeted due to camp availability.

Spring and Fall Officer training had over 100 attendees and participants. 3 fall rallies have been performed and two summer service socials. We have received positive feedback on all these events with some good ideas to build upon.

Promoting District Growth

Idea:

We are looking for stabilization in the District Officer role. Over the last two years, the board has received multiple resignations and been forced into action to remove inactive officers. Some resignations will occur as life events and college life occurs. The current numbers seem to reflect issues with understanding expectations prior to joining, and lack of training. The goal is to have no hole in the elected board members by the end of the Circle K administrative Year.

We are hoping to look at areas to focus on growth. Many clubs appear to be on an island with significant travel time between them. We are going to look at clubs that may be able to shorten the travel time and increase the fellowship aspect.

Current Progress:

We are currently experiencing some turnover with the district board as the fall semester has started. Currently board resignations have occurred for health reasons (1), job/internship opportunities (1), and not able to perform the duties (2). We have been lucky in that people are stepping up on the board to cover and new people are joining the board.

It appears that we may be ready to explode in club growth. With one new club and one club saved over the summer months, the new year is about to start. Alvernia and Luzerne County Community College are in the middle of the chartering process. We have established communication with Carnegie Mellon and Lebanon Valley. Our expectation is that they will be moved to active this year. Leads are popping up and we are working to develop them into active clubs as fast as we can. (Bloomsburg, PSU – Altoona, PSU – Scranton, Keystone, and Bucknell) We are actively tracking down clubs that have lost communication over the summer.



The years where we have had the greatest success with new club building were the years where we had a lot of involvement by the Trustees, Governor, Governor-elect and Executive Director.
3. Also, your promotion, early registration and support of our Midwinter Conference, District Convention and other events/fundraisers are really vital. We need all board members to be out front and a cheerleader and active participant in everything.
4. While not large on a dollar scale, our fundraising for convention is really rather remarkable. From what I know, no other District in Kiwanis International does this (at least on our scale) and many of them are really struggling with their conventions. Not counting in kind donations, we fundraise over 25% of the convention budget. This allows us to do some things we otherwise could not do, keep costs down for our attendees and keep the convention solidly in the black.
5. Based on what I am seeing so far this September, it is my opinion The Formula is working. While I don't believe that we will see a membership gain, I think we will see a loss that is at least half as small as last year and last year was smaller by half than the preceding year. So we are trending in the right direction. However, a loss is still a loss and death by smaller cuts is just a slower death. So we still need to get into the black on membership. I think we will next year barring something completely beyond our control.
6. Thank you for what each of you do for Kiwanis and for all your work.

I am honored to have been elected as the Pennsylvania District of Kiwanis Governor at the 98th Annual District Convention in Erie.

Since the last board meeting, I have been actively involved in numerous phone calls, emails and meetings with district and international leadership to continue preparing for the 2015-2016 year. I look forward to working closely with the Board of Directors, Lieutenant Governor Team and the District membership to accomplish each of the goals of the District.

- Appointed Trustees Keith, Mike and Bill to be on a Budget and Financial Review committee with Kevin and I.

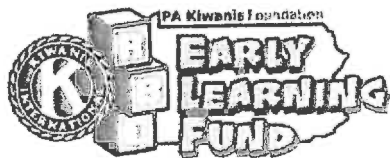
Other comments, events and information



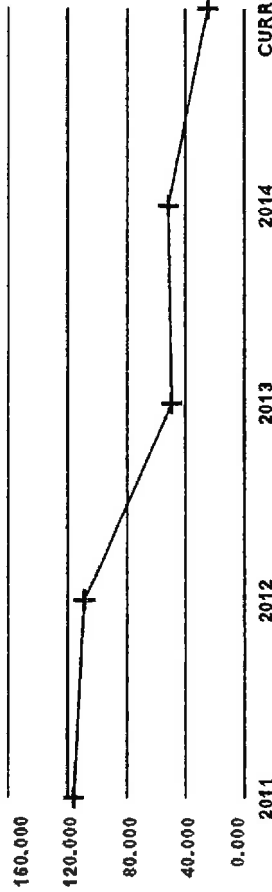

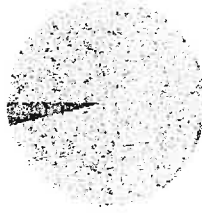

- At this time we are seeing a loss of \$150.00 on the shirts as a District fundraiser. This is because of having to pay for all the shirts we ordered. The cost of those shirts, less the cost of those sold at Midwinter and District Convention, went against shirt sales.
- All shirts sold between now and Midwinter will go to bottom line (profit) until such time as we have to replenish inventory.
- Inventory replenishment costs will be immediately debited against shirt sales with appropriate adjustments made for shirts sold at convention and conferences.

It is my recommendation that we replace her on the following basis:


- 10 weeks per year at 37.5 hours @ \$13.00 per hour with a total cost of \$4,875.00

- The goal would be to hire a replacement starting May 1st and allow the position to be vacant for April 2015. We would rely on volunteers to help in April.

Savings in 2015-16: At least \$4,800.00

Savings in 2016-17: At least \$3,400.00

I believe this proposal will allow us to achieve the goal of achieving substantial savings while maintaining services and support our members expect, implementing all the Kiwanis Family Conferences in Pennsylvania in the high standard we have come to expect and maintaining a professional office and atmosphere for the organization in Pennsylvania.

The Early Literacy Challenge


80% of preschool and after-school programs serving low-income populations have no age-appropriate books for their children. (Mouzon, Susan B., et al. Access for All: Closing the Book Gap for Children in Early Childhood. Newark, DE: International Reading Association, 2001, p. 5.)

Children growing up in homes with at least 20 books get 8 years more schooling than children from bookless homes, independent of their parents' education, occupation, and class. (Kane, M.D., Kelley, J., Skora, J., & Trause, D. J. (2010). Family scholarly culture and educational success: Books and schooling in 27 nations. Research in Social Stratification and Mobility, 28(2), 171-197.)



- This presentation provides options for an ongoing partnership with PA Kiwanis, EDC Educational Services providing a 50% matching grant is something we are 100% committed to doing to improve literacy for Pennsylvania students. When Kiwanians pull together, this is a snippet of what is possible.
- Some of the great ways we can also help in fundraising would be:
 - **Cards for a Cause**- Individuals purchase a hand crafted box of 30 all occasion or kid friendly cards sold at \$30 per box. The club receives \$13 per box sold. This is a great way to raise money since everyone uses greeting cards in some way shape or form.
 - **Reach for the Stars**-Kiwanis Kids can read for 30 minutes per day and get sponsors. If 10 Kiwanis Kids asked 10 people to sponsor them with \$10 for 10 days that's \$1000 raised. They would keep \$300 and the other \$700 could be used to purchase books for themselves or donate or a combination of both.
